He gave a short account of the work that was being accomplished in regard to the insects of the country and also gave notes on the species collected.

The lecture was illustrated by lantern slides which were so selected as to bring out the conditions under which the work was being accomplished. Prof. Wickham's close observations on the characteristic peculiarities of the people as well as the principal points of interest enabled him to give an excellent impression of the general conditions where ever he went.
