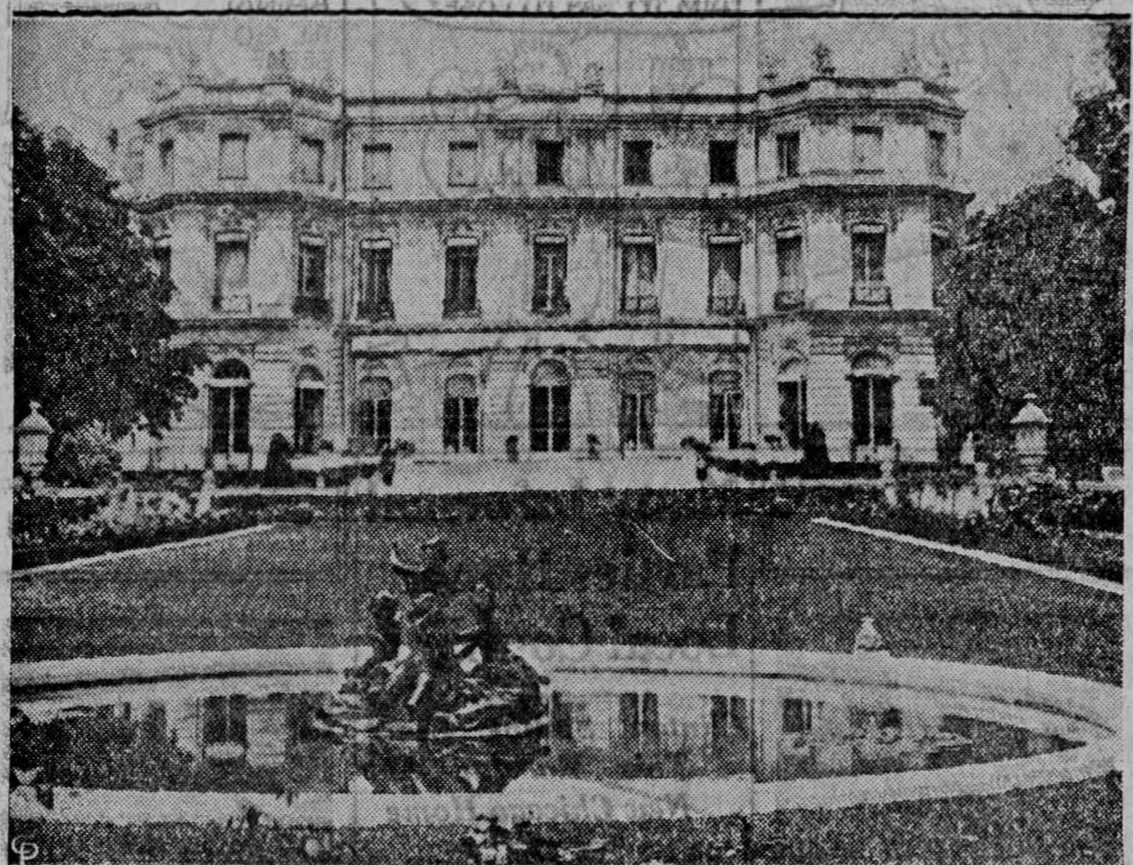

The rightists are trying to take advantage of the split and re-establish the Bourbon regime. They say make it work.



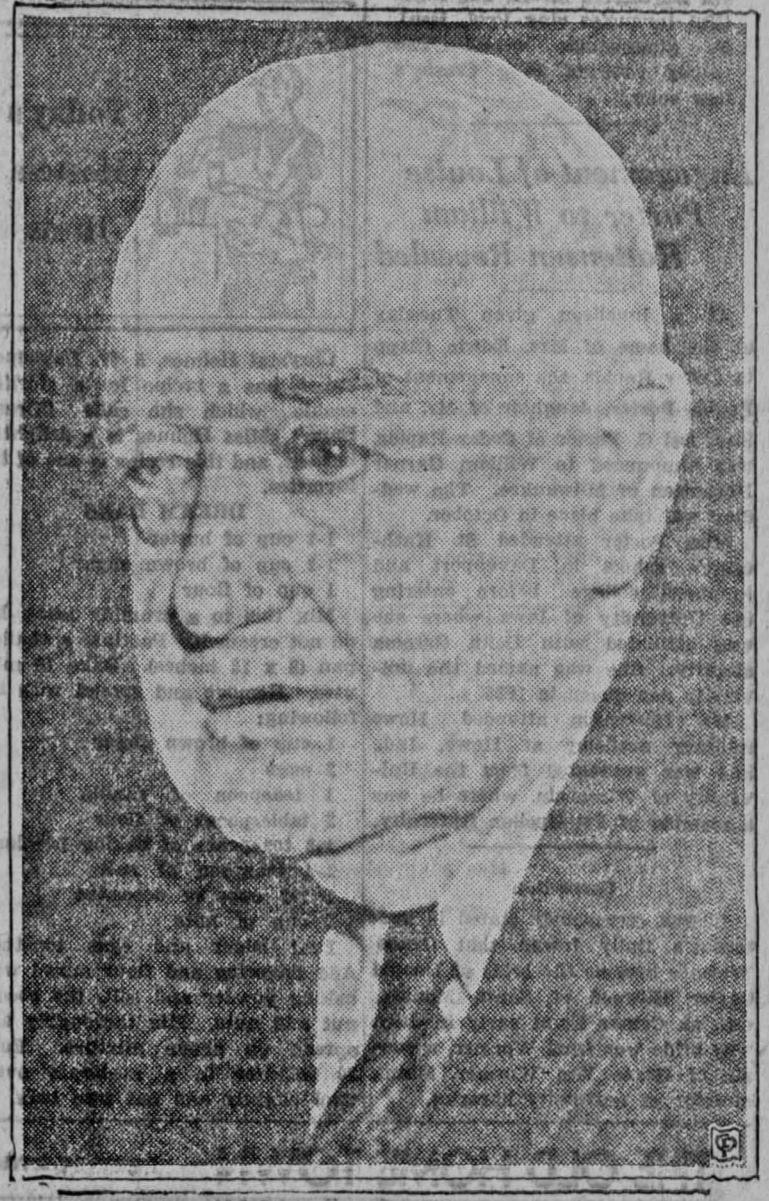
No pasture land—Old Dobbin eats leaves from hedge

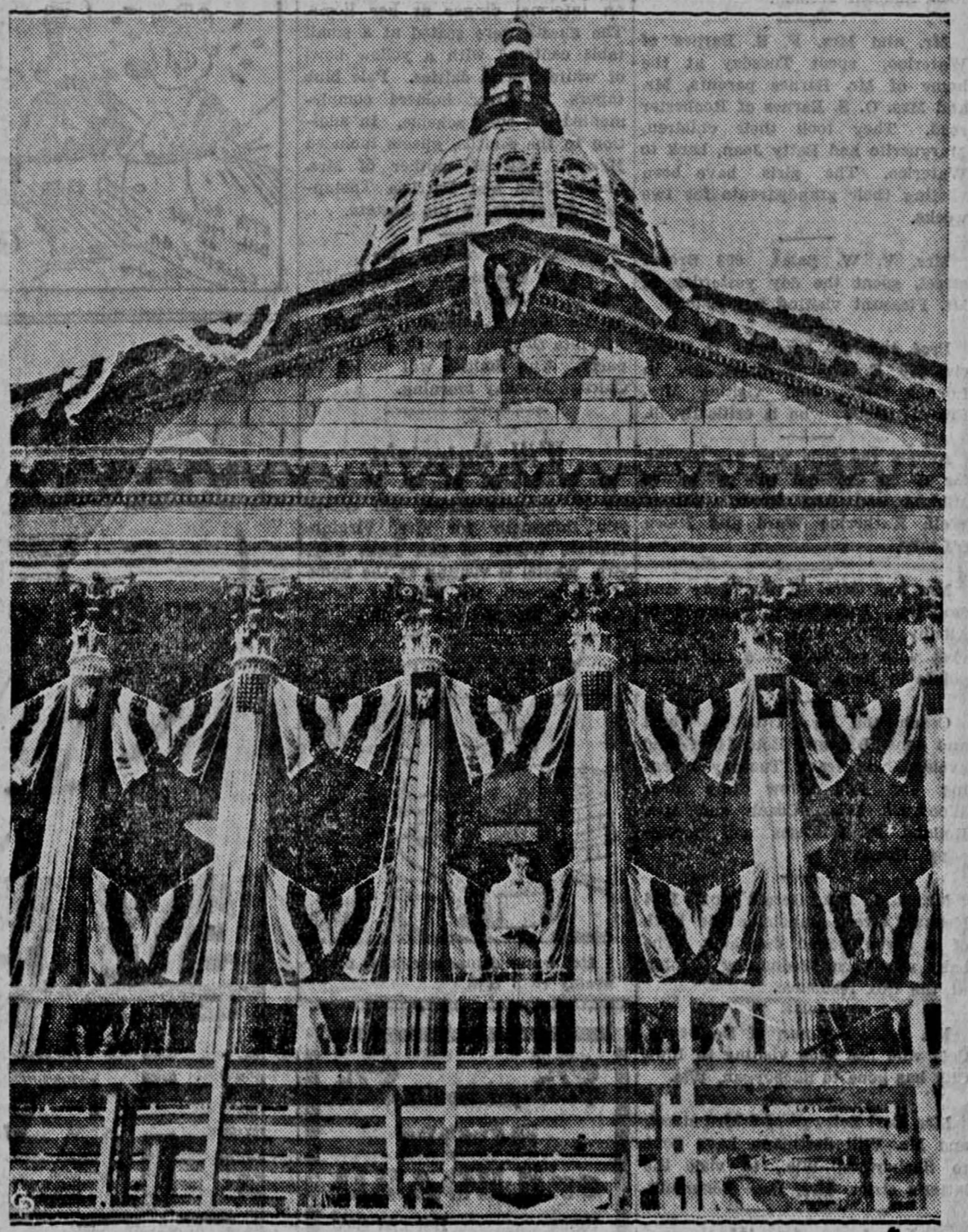

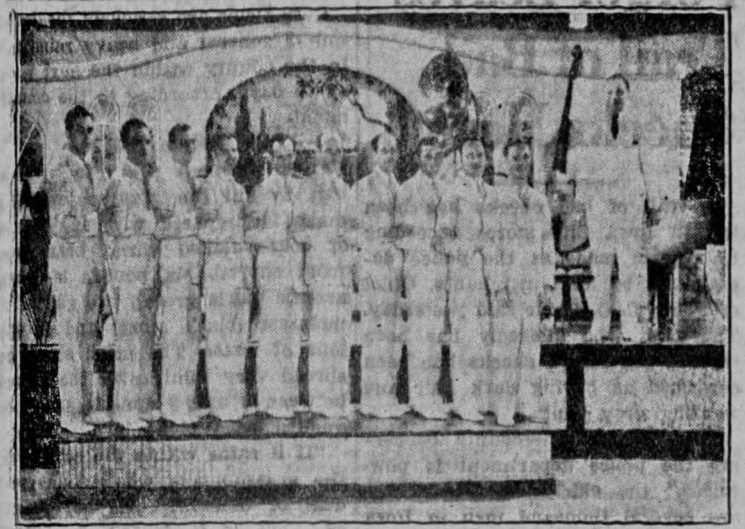
