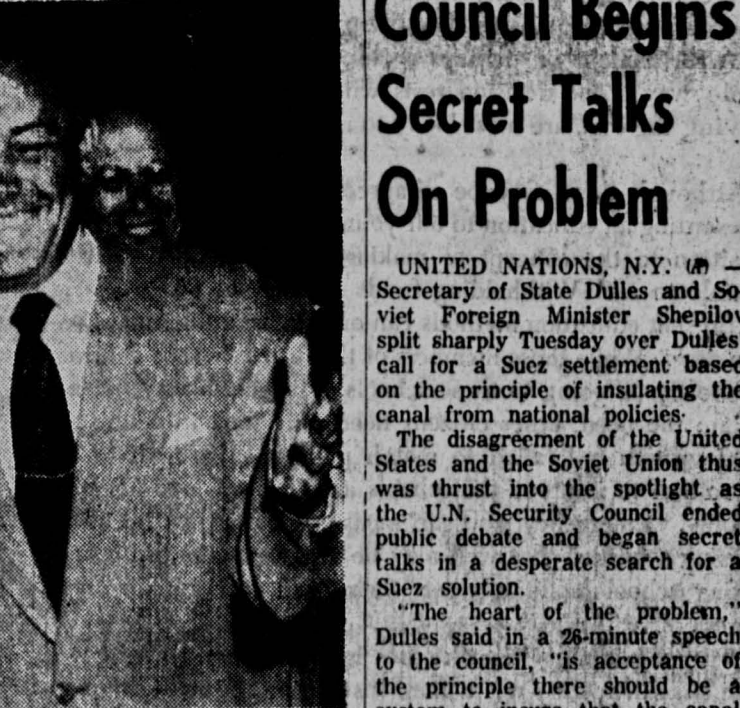

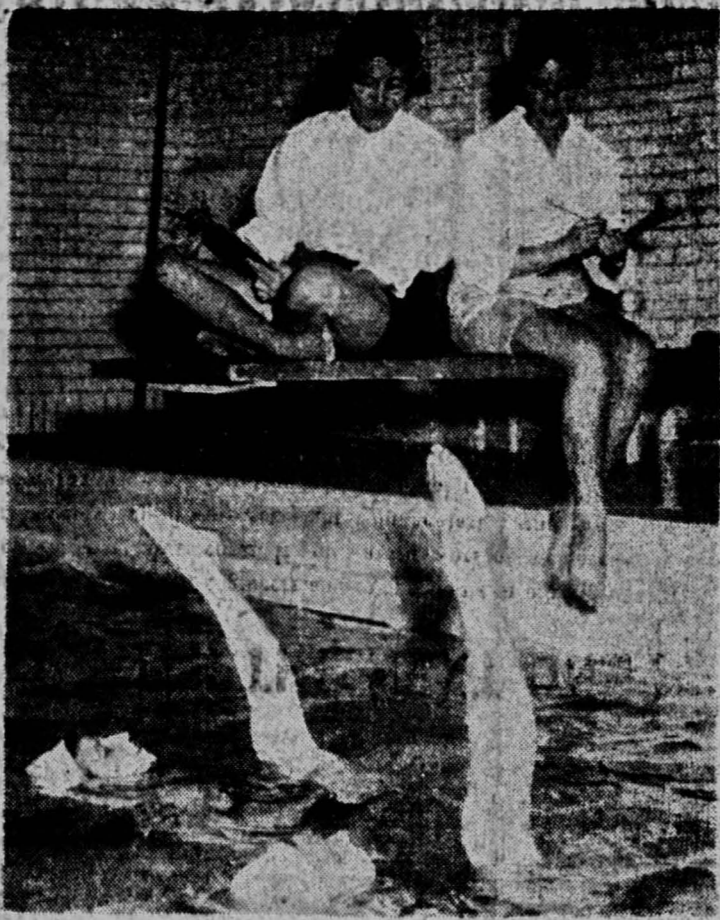

Record Review—'56 'New Faces' Not So Bouncy

"New Faces of 1956" is certainly not the highly polished and bouncy musical that its famous 1952 predecessor was. Neither is the new RCA Victor recording of the '56 version tell you.

"New Faces of '52" was filled with some outstanding performers who artistically poured effervescent material to theater and movie audiences thirsty for musical comedy refreshment.

Were it not for the excitement caused by "My Fair Lady" and "Most Happy Fella," Broadway's biggest hits today, theatergoers might find the '56 revue more tasty than it really is. I judge from the Victor record, which tells me that the new show has performers, too, though few rise above competence.

Some of the material, instead of bubbling over, almost fizzes out. In sum, it's the sort of thing you might hear on any run-of-the-mill TV spectacular.

Yet, through all this emerges a female impersonator whose imitation of Tallulah Bankhead is the highlight of the album and, reportedly, of the whole show. His name is T.C. Jones and — on the record, at least — he is at all times hilarious. His version of "I'll Be Seeing You" (with a few "daahlings" thrown in for good measure) is one of the funniest numbers I've heard since the 1952 revue's "Boston Beguine."

The only other number I can remember from a couple of hearings is "He Flipped," sung by Ann Henry in a sensuous and nonchalant style suggestive of Lena Horne's — in fact, just plain suggestive.

Other people in Victor's original cast recording are Amru Sani, who, it seems, has to be seen to be fully appreciated; Inga Swenson, Tiger Haynes, and John Reardon.

1921 Grid Champs To Attend Homecoming

One of the greatest teams in Iowa football history will be cheering for the 1956 Hawkeyes when they play their Homecoming game against Michigan, Nov. 3.

Members and coaches of SUI's 1921 Big Ten and Western championships team have been invited to the Homecoming game, Prof. Glen D. Devine, of the SUI Department of Athletics, and right halfback of the 1921 team, announced Tuesday.

The grid stars also are scheduled to be introduced at the pep rally, Nov. 2, and feted at a dinner in the Devine home following the game.

The '21 team has held a reunion every five years since 1941. Eight players and four coaches have accepted the invitation for the '56 reunion.

"We are hoping that many of the others will be able to be here too," Prof. Devine said.

To football fans the 1921 SUI team is one that will never be forgotten. Before that time, SUI football teams had made a shameful showing in conference play.

To quote the 1923 Hawkeye, "Iowa became a joke as far as football was concerned, and it seemed that Iowa would never have a chance to lead the conference teams in the final standing."

In 1918 Howard H. Jones took over SUI football and began building for a championship team for 1919. But the breaks didn't come until 1921.

The season began that year with a crippling list of injuries but by the middle of November the Hawks had a perfect record.

They defeated Knox, Notre Dame, Illinois, Purdue, Minnesota and Indiana. This record gave the Hawks the Big Ten Championship.

Their victory over Notre Dame early in the season also gave them a clear-cut claim to the Western championship. Notre Dame had outclassed all other teams in the West that year and defeated the two strongest Eastern teams. If Iowa had been able to play Yale and West Point, it is possible that they could have placed high in the eastern championship.

When the 1921 football season closed and honorary teams were selected every man of the Iowa football team was placed on one of the honorary teams.

Left tackle George Thompson is the only member of the team not living.

Present at the 1956 Homecoming reunion will be captain and quarterback Aubrey Devine, Reno, Nev., right halfback Glen Devine, Iowa City, tackle Duke Slater, Chicago, right end Lester Beiding, Naperville, Ill., left end Dr. Max Kadesky, Dubuque, left halfback Craven Shuttleworth, Cedar Rapids, halfback Glenn Miller, Waterloo, and lineman Dr. Moldingbauer, Charles City.

The five coaches planning to attend the reunion are: assistant coaches Albert Jenkins of Cedar Rapids, Lawrence Black of Davenport, W. S. Kelly of Minneapolis, backfield coach Col. Hill of San Antonio, Tex., and trainer Dr. Walter Fiesler of Ft. Dodge.

Offer Financial Aid For Foreign Study

Graduate students in geography interested in conducting field research abroad may apply for financial assistance under a program conducted by the National Research Council of the National Academy of Sciences and sponsored by the Office of Naval Research.
