





Hawks Blitz Nevada 88-46 ChiSox Russ Kemmerer Wants To Be Clergyman As Don Nelson Hits for 26

Iowa's basketball team turned in its best scoring effort of the year here Thursday night overpowering a cold - shooting Nevada squad, 88-46. The Hawks' previous high was against Los Angeles State in their 82-72 win here Monday.

Senior Co-captain Don Nelson led the Hawks with 26 points and received ample help from guards Andy Hankins and Matt Szykowny who hit 17 and 10 respectively.

After a "ho-hum" first half in which Iowa built up a 39-27 lead, the Hawkeyes opened a blitzkrieg 49-point scoring attack.

lowa hit 34 of 77 field goal attempts for a .442 percentage, but the fast break attack was only half of the Hawkeye vic-

Coach Sharm Scheuerman emptied his bench as the Hawks' second half lead neared 40 points, and all the subs turned in creditable

Sophomore forward Jerry Messick, who didn't play at all in the first half, hauled down 10 rebounds and scored seven points in the second half surge.

Iowa's season mark to 4-2. Nevada's record is 1-7. The Wolf Pack lost 91-59 to Purdue of Big Ten Monday night.


