The status of many recipients could logically be expected to change during regular reviews of their circumstances, but the high number of those removed from eligibility during the last two-and-a-half years is due largely to the administration's decision that
benefits may be stopped without demonstrable change in an inbenefits may be stopped w

Is such a shift in policy reasonable? Not according to many state officials, who receive federal funds to administer the social security program on a local level
In July New York State Commissioner of Social Services Cesar A. Perales publicly scolded the federal government for not nounced a moratorium on removing people from eligibility rolls in New York. State officials and agencies in New York,
Massachusetts and New Jersey have filed lawsuits contesting Massachusetts and New Jersey have filed lawsuits contesting
federal cuts. The governors of Kansas and West Virginia refuse to follow precisely portions of the federal policy. Elsewhere state offollow precisely portions of the federal policy. Elsewhere state orn-
ficials are cooperating with beneficiaries suing the federal government. And last week North Carolina Gov. James B. Hunt ordered a cases of fraud.
The federal government has not penalized any states yet for
refusal to comply with current policies. The reason: the image of President Ronald Reagan, who is trying to appear more humane in his attitude toward federal programs for the needy as the next election looms in the distance.
