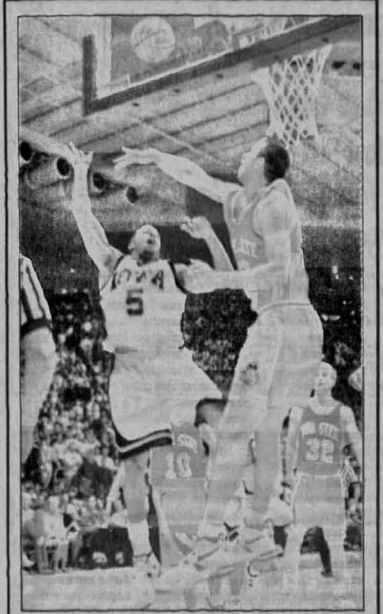

Clinton contemplates re-election run in '96

MIAMI (AP) — Even in this dark hour of Democratic politics, President Bill Clinton said he plans to run for re-election. "Absolutely," he said when *The Miami Herald* asked whether he intended to run again. "But I can't serve if I worry about getting re-elected."

In an interview conducted aboard Air Force One before the Summit of the Americas, the president also was asked whether he still enjoyed his work. "Oh, I love the job," he replied. "I came to this job promising to take on the tough issues — all the easy stuff had been done. And I knew when I came here that I had to be willing to ... not think about re-election, instead think about doing what was right for the country."

Coffee culprit ordered to clean bathrooms

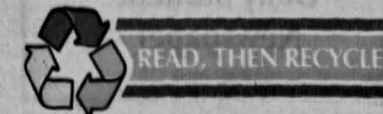
ST. JOSEPH, Mo. (AP) — A man who was videotaped urinating into a company coffee pot has received an appropriately unpleasant sentence: cleaning bathrooms. Milton Ross, 41, pleaded guilty Friday to third-degree assault. He was placed on two years' probation and ordered to spend 100 hours cleaning public restrooms.

"I made a stupid choice," said Ross, who was fired from his job after the incident. "Although I did do it, I didn't expect it would be on tape and become a worldwide issue. Now I want to get on with my life."

A covert camera set up by a co-worker caught Ross urinating into a coffee pot at Wire Rope Corp. of America in July. Ross said his action was part of an ongoing feud with the co-worker.

Rawlings resigns from UI

Students stunned by decision

UI students were shocked at Saturday's announcement by UI officials that UI President Hunter Rawlings will leave June 30.

Although rumors circulated last week, Rawlings' resignation was not confirmed until a press conference Saturday afternoon. Students agreed the resignation was unexpected, but the news evoked a wide span of student sentiment, ranging from feelings of loss to unconcern.

"It's a shocker because you kind of think of your president as a little more permanent," UI senior Chris Jones said.

Gretchen Lohman, UI Student Government vice president, said

"He seems to care about the students, and in that sense it's going to be a loss."

Leah Klevar, UI graduate student

she had not seen the resignation coming.

"I was kind of surprised at the news," she said. "At the beginning of our term, he seemed content at the UI."

Rawlings' involvement in student events made him a strong leader, Lohman said.

"I think he was a really good leader in a sense that he would participate in events on campus, making sure he showed up at events which were important to the students," she said.

Accessibility and concern for students were characteristics Rawlings displayed, said UI graduate

Regents gear up for search process

Efforts are being made to have Hunter Rawlings' successor swiftly selected and prepared to assume the UI presidency on July 1.

The Iowa state Board of Regents is expected to address Rawlings' resignation and to discuss the search for his replacement at its meeting Wednesday, Vice President for University Relations Ann Rhodes said.

"We are hoping that the board of regents will initiate a search process very shortly and that we may have someone in place by the time Hunter leaves," she said.

Rawlings announced Saturday he will step down from his position June 30 to take over as president of Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y.

Regents President Marvin Berenstein said he is hopeful a successor will take over the UI presidency by July 1, but speculation was difficult because the search process has not begun, he added.

If the regents have not made a permanent decision about Rawlings' replacement, they have the option of appointing

either an interim president or an acting president. Both would be

Search Committee

If the standard procedure to select a new president is followed, a search committee will choose six finalists. The Iowa state Board of Regents will then make the final choice.

The search committee will be made up of 17 to 20 people, including:

- 9 Faculty members selected by the UI Faculty Senate
- 1 Representative of the deans of the 10 UI colleges
- 3 Staff members selected by the UI Staff Council
- 2 Students—one undergraduate and one graduate
- 2 Alumni
- 0-3 Up to three additional representatives chosen by the Iowa state Board of Regents

Cornell post entices president

After six and a half years as president of the UI, Hunter Rawlings announced Saturday he will step down from his position to take over the presidency of Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y.

Vice President for University Relations Ann Rhodes made the announcement that Rawlings, 49, would resign as UI president at the end of June. Rawlings flew to Itha-

ca Friday night and is expected to return to Iowa City at the end of the week.

"Hunter Rawlings, president of the UI, will be leaving on June 30 to assume the presidency of Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y.," Rhodes said at a news conference Saturday. "He will assume the presidency there on July 1."

Rawlings was unavailable for comment but released the following statement to be read at the press conference: "Cornell University represents an extraordinary opportunity for leadership, and I am honored to be asked to assume its presidency. I want to emphasize that I have enormous affection and respect for the University of Iowa, one of this country's academic gems. It has been, and continues to be, a real pleasure for me to serve as its president."

Cornell University is an Ivy League school with a combined undergraduate and graduate student enrollment of approximately 19,000. Rawlings will succeed Frank Rhodes as the 10th president of Cornell.

While colleagues expressed disappointment, none were surprised that Rawlings had been named as Cornell's next president.

Dave Skorton, UI vice president for Research, said the announcement was unexpected, but he was not surprised other universities were recruiting Rawlings.

"Someone of his stature gets asked to look at a lot of jobs," Skorton said.

Iowa state Board of Regents President Marvin Berenstein said Rawlings' appointment reflects well on Rawlings, the UI and the system of public higher education in Iowa.

"I believe people seeking new leaders look to a system like ours because the administrative leaders have had an opportunity to act on their own behalf," he said. "It is a compliment to Hunter and the regent system in Iowa."

Faculty Senate President Richard Hurtig said Rawlings exhibits the high-quality leadership many universities look for.

"We live in a time when there is a continual search by institutions

by President Clinton. But Elders, defiant to the end, said she does not regret saying schoolchildren should be taught about masturbation and suggested that her remarks were misinterpreted.

"People have taken a lot of things I've said in a most unusual way," she said in a telephone interview from her home outside Washington.

Incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich, who has repeatedly assailed Elders' views, called her "a remarkably destructive person" who has long deserved removal from office.

And Rep. Marge Roukema of New Jersey, the most senior Republican woman in the House, said, "Great! What took her so long?" after Clinton demanded and received Elders' resignation.

White House Chief of Staff Leon

"I don't regret what I said. I could have said it better."

Panetta said Clinton acted because Elders had ignored repeated warnings from administration officials to moderate her public statements. "This was one too many," he said.

He cited previous Elders statements in which she said that the government should consider legalizing drugs and "teaching 5-year-olds to use condoms," as well as



Elders that anti-abortion Catholics have "a love affair" with fetuses.

Her firing stemmed from her remarks Dec. 1 at a World AIDS Day conference in New York, when she was asked whether taboos about public discussion of masturbation should be lifted.

Elders said, "As per your specific question in regard to masturbation, I think that is something that is a part of human sexuality, and it's a part of something that perhaps should be taught. But we've

STUDENT FAINTS AFTER 72-HOUR SESSION

Freshman passes out in studying marathon

One UI freshman learned the hard way that pots of coffee and two-liter bottles of Coke just won't replace a good night's sleep when cramming for finals.

A total of nine hours of shut-eye throughout a three-day studying binge wasn't enough for Tolstoy Mahendra Patel, who fainted in his Currier Residence Hall room Saturday night while studying for his engineering, physics and calculus finals.

Patel, 17, was sprawled on the floor of his room when floormates Mark Skala and Judd Picco discovered him and called 911.

"We noticed he was laying on the floor, and it didn't look normal, so I picked him up and set him on his bed," Skala said. "He

seemed disoriented, so we called 911, and the paramedics came and took over."

Patel admitted that Saturday was not the first time he had passed out after studying too long without sleep. When paramedics arrived, Patel refused to be admitted to a hospital because he was confident he could recover without medical attention, he said.

"The paramedics asked if I needed to go to the hospital, but this has happened before so I knew what I had to do," he said. "I knew I needed sleep, and I knew if I took an hour to myself to recover I would be all right."

Patel said after the paramedics left, he took an hour to relax and then hit the books for a few more hours before heading to

Hawkeye sportscaster discovers his calling

Larry Morgan relives his childhood fantasy every time he sits down behind the microphone and gazes at the black-and-gold parquet floor of Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Morgan has covered Iowa basketball and football games for the

Raycom Network for eight years, bringing games to hundreds of Hawkeye fans who can't get tickets.

"I always wanted to do sports," Morgan said. "This is the best TV play-by-play job in the state because of the fans."

A lack of physical skills steered Morgan away from the court and to the microphone at an early age.

"I had no athletic ability whatsoever," he said. "If I could do it, I wouldn't talk about it."

Talking about sports has been Morgan's job for 20 years as sportscasting for high-school and college games took him from Kansas to California and eventually to Des Moines, where he called Drake University football and basketball games.

For 12 years, Morgan's days have begun at 3:30 a.m., working as a morning disc jockey for KGGO, a Des Moines radio station. As half of the morning team known as "Lou and Larry," Morgan entertains his listeners as they battle rush-hour traffic.

On game days, Morgan leaves the radio station after his show is done at 9 a.m. and heads to Iowa City for a day with the Hawkeyes.

The first game-day events are practice sessions for each team, during which Morgan and co-host Mac McCausland talk with coaches and players.

"We talk about everything from

style of play to personnel to coaching philosophies," Morgan said. "We talk to Tom (Davis, head coach of Iowa men's basketball), talk to a

few players, get a feel for how they feel about the game."

Between practices, the Raycom staff meets with the show's produc-

er to discuss plans for the night's broadcast.

After watching practices and preparing for the game, Morgan gets to relax for a couple of hours.

"I just try to take it easy and get away," he said. Morgan often relaxes by taking a walk around campus or going out for dinner.

Pregame activities resume at 5 p.m., when Morgan returns to Carver-Hawkeye for last-minute preparations.

"Basically, at that point a lot of your work is done," he said. "I just try to think what the game means and kind of relax."

At tip-off time, usually 7:05 p.m., the fun begins for Morgan, who is assisted by a TV monitor which shows the broadcast and a headset that connects him to the program's producer.

Aided by a meticulously prepared notebook containing team and player statistics, Morgan channels his enthusiasm into an exciting play-by-play for television viewers. Morgan said he spends two hours before every game compiling the career highs and averages for each team's players.

"You never want to use all the stuff you have because that means A, you're talking too much; and B, you don't have enough information," he said.

After the game, Morgan attends press conferences held by Tom Davis for comments to use during his morning radio broadcast.

Morgan returns home at 10:45 p.m., after putting in more than 18 hours at work. He said although game days are long, the fun he has at work compensates for a lack of sleep.

"If you enjoy what you do, it's not a big deal," he said. "You could let that get to you, but I try not to."

Morgan said he plans to sportscast until he retires.

"I'd like to keep doing this as long as I can do it," he said.

Divorce looms for 'godfather of soul'

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — James Brown filed for divorce from his third wife a day after he was charged with knocking her to the floor.

Brown surrendered Thursday night at the Aiken County Sheriff's Office, which had issued a warrant for his arrest. On Friday, he filed for divorce from his wife, Adrienne.

Brown, who is free on a \$279.25 cash bond, faces up to 30 days in jail and a \$200 fine if convicted.

The 61-year-old "godfather of soul" is already on probation for aggravated assault and failing to stop his car for a police officer. He served two years in prison on those convictions.

In 1988, Brown was charged with assault with intent to kill for allegedly beating his wife with a pipe and shooting into her car. The charges were dropped.

Kerrigan refuses to grin and bear sports double standard

RADNOR, Pa. (AP) — Figure skater Nancy Kerrigan said she's tired of being criticized for not smiling after every performance.

"They've labeled us 'ice princesses,'" she said in the Dec. 17 issue of *TV Guide*. "In other sports they're getting in fights and throwing their equipment. For us to get a little upset, I mean, so what?"

Kerrigan admitted she's ill at ease with her popularity.

"I love for people to know I am on the ice. I have been doing it for 19 years, and that's where I'm comfortable," she said. "But off the ice, it's a little difficult to always be who everybody wants."

And what is that? "Perfect," she said. "There's no such thing."

The 1994 Olympic silver medalist will enter only two skating competitions this season.

Victim of funk singer granted \$1.8 million

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A jury awarded more than \$1.8 million to a woman who claimed funk singer Rick James and his girlfriend beat her and held her hostage in a Hollywood hotel room.

The jury will meet today to consider whether James should pay punitive damages to Mary Sauger, said her lawyer, Paul S. Sigelman.

James, 45, best known for the 1981 hit "Super Freak," was convicted of assaulting Sauger. He was sentenced in January to five years and four months in prison.

James' girlfriend, Tanya Anne Hijazi, 23, pleaded guilty to assault with a deadly weapon and was sentenced to four years in prison.

Sauger, 36, hasn't recovered psychologically from the Nov. 3, 1992, attack at the exclusive St. James Club and Hotel and is unable to work, Sigelman said.

'Star Trek' captain Stewart wanted old generation in new flick

NEW YORK (AP) — Two captains of the Enterprise prove to be better than one in the hit movie "Star Trek Generations."

One reason William Shatner appears as Capt. James T. Kirk is that Patrick Stewart lobbied hard

to ensure that Shatner was included in the latest film.

"I've been passionate about that from the first time that 'Next Generation' movie had been mentioned," Stewart said in an interview with the Associated Press. "I didn't want us to sail into the future just as 'The Next Generation' cast."

Stewart starred as Capt. Jean-Luc Picard in the television series "Star Trek: The Next Generation,"

which ended in May. Shatner starred in the original "Star Trek" series, which ran from 1966-1969.

"I thought not only would it be absolutely appropriate that there should be some transitional moment in which the baton got passed from Capt. Kirk and the old crew to us, I also felt it would be awfully attractive to the audience as well if they were given the opportunity of seeing the two captains on the same screen," Stewart said.

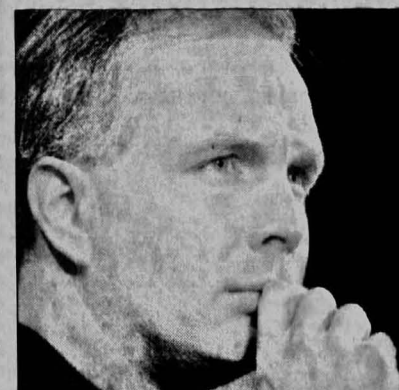
Bargain-minded Brooks waits for after-Christmas sales

Policy struggle unaffected by resignation

The immediate effects of Hunter Rawlings' departure on the UI classroom materials policy are unclear, but UI officials said the issue has been directed away from Rawlings in recent months.

Rawlings was the author of the current policy, which contains the controversial phrase "unusual and unexpected materials." The phrase has become part of the rallying cries of policy opponents, and the policy itself has spawned numerous protests and debates since its implementation almost one year ago.

"I expect this issue to be resolved within the next six months. I'm tired of it. Hopefully, this matter will be done with before the new president comes on board."

Iowa state Board of Regents President Marvin Berenstein said he hopes to have the issue fully debated and resolved before Rawlings officially resigns on June 30.

"I expect this issue to be resolved within the next six months," Berenstein said. "I'm tired of it. Hopefully, this matter will be done with before the new president comes on board."

The classroom materials policy, commonly referred to as the "sex act" policy even though it doesn't specify sexual content, is primarily in the hands of the UI Faculty Senate, Berenstein said.

"I don't think President Rawlings' leaving will have any effect on the policy," Berenstein said. "Lately it has not been involving the president. I don't think that President Rawlings has as much to do with it as the Faculty Senate does."

The pressure to solve the policy issue has been placed on Rawlings too often, Berenstein said.

"The administration is more than just President Rawlings," he said. "One of his great strengths was building an administrative team to deal with problems at the university."

Rawlings was criticized by the Campaign for Academic Freedom for composing the final draft of the policy while students and faculty were on winter break last year. The policy was proposed on Jan. 17 and approved unanimously by the regents on Jan. 19. The debate has continued since then, with CAF being the most vocal opponent.

The Faculty Senate reopened debate on the issue, deciding to oppose the "unusual and unexpected" clause at the Nov. 29 Faculty Council meeting.

Faculty Senate President Richard Hurtig said the issue created the wrong image of what the UI is about and faculty members are anxious to resolve the situation.

"I don't think that his leaving is going to necessarily alter any time course," Hurtig said. "The faculty would like to see this issue resolved quickly, independent of the departure of President Rawlings."

The ball is now in the Faculty Senate's proverbial court, Hurtig said.

"This is in the faculty's hands," Hurtig said. "We're trying to come up with something that is acceptable to the faculty and to the regents."

The UI should continue to work on this and other issues throughout the search for a new president, Hurtig said.

"We don't want to put the university in a state of suspended animation until we find a new president," he said. "There are a number of problems that still have to be addressed."

Campaign for Academic Freedom Co-chairman Israel Reyes said he hopes the decisions surrounding the policy are made judiciously.

"I hope that any action taken isn't taken precipitously just to get it over with," Reyes said. "If they do get rid of the policy, I hope it's done with the intention of bettering the situation at the university and not as a going-away present for Hunter Rawlings."

BOARD SADDENED BY ANNOUNCEMENT

Regents laud Rawlings for contributions to UI

Members of the Iowa state Board of Regents were not surprised by UI President Hunter Rawlings' announcement Saturday that he would resign his position, saying the UI was a "breeding ground for leaders."

"Hunter's left a lot of imprints for us to build on. But we'll get a fresh perspective now, which will be good for the UI."

Iowa state Board of Regents President Marvin Berenstein said Rawlings had marshaled a highly regarded administrative staff during his 6 1/2-year presidency.

"He has assembled a whole new set of players who will continue with his policies," he said.

Board member Thomas Collins agreed that Rawlings had built a solid foundation for the next president.

"Hunter's left a lot of imprints for us to build on," he said. "But we'll get a fresh perspective now, which will be good for the UI."

Changes of administration at universities like the UI are expected, Collins said.

"Although you don't plan for this day, it's part of the evolution," he said. "College presidency is an endless relay race."

Berenstein said the UI would handle the transition smoothly.

"Change is kind of a process not dissimilar to a sporting event," he said. "If a quarterback gets hurt, you have someone else go in to lead the team."

Rawlings announced Saturday that he would resign from the UI to assume the presidency of Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y. Rawlings will vacate the UI presidency on June 30.

Rawlings' transition from the UI to an Ivy League school is a compliment to him as well as the UI, said board member Thomas Dorr.

"This is the sort of thing we've come to expect at Iowa," Dorr said. "Iowa is a strong breeding ground for leaders."

Rawlings will be missed for his ability to work well with others, board member Nancy Pellett said.

"I've been on the board only one year, and he's made a very smooth transition for me," she said. "We hate to see him go, but we're proud of the fact they've (Cornell) come for him."

Under a new president, the

UI will glimpse a new outlook on higher education, but Rawlings will also gain experience, Collins said.

"In Hunter's point of view, this is a great opportunity and an excellent choice," he said.

INSTRUCTOR TO TEACH WESTERN CIVILIZATION SINCE 1792

Controversial professor to take on GER

A UI history professor accused of having an abrasive teaching style by many of his students will be teaching one of the largest classes at the UI next semester.

Earlier this semester, many of Professor David Schoenbaum's students said he frequently yelled at his classes, calling them "stupid" and "just part of the MTV generation." Three-fourths of the students in his Historical Perspectives I class dropped the course.

Despite the complaints against him, Schoenbaum will teach Western Civilization Since 1792, a General Education Requirement class taken primarily by undergrads. Up to 352 students may enroll in the course.

Schoenbaum volunteered to teach the course, said Jeffrey Cox, chairman of the history department.

"It's always a challenge to get people to teach the class," he said. "It's difficult to teach because it's large and a required course. He volunteered. He's taught it before in the many years he's been here."

Cox said he has never received any student criticism about Schoenbaum.

However, UI senior Sue Kluever said she did complain to Cox about Schoenbaum.

"I went in to talk to Cox last January," she said. "I had a whole page full of complaints and things I wanted to talk about. Most of them were about the way Schoenbaum treated me. I respect Schoenbaum because he's so knowledgeable, but he was so condescending and rude. He made me feel totally incompetent. Cox told me that not a semester goes by that students don't complain about Schoenbaum."

Cox later said he didn't remember making such a statement to Kluever.

Kluever said she was concerned that Schoenbaum would be teaching a class taken predominantly by freshmen and sophomores.

"I am very concerned about his influence on undergrads, who are naturally less confident and less sure about their abilities," she said.

Schoenbaum would not answer questions about his decision to teach Western Civilization Since

1792 but said student complaints would not affect his teaching.

"It is nice to be liked, but it is not a qualification to teach," he said. "You can't deal with higher education as if it were toothpaste and the university as if it were Kmart."

UI senior Adrian Enochian said Schoenbaum's style is difficult but not verbally abusive.

"I don't think there will be a problem with him teaching (Western Civilization)," he said. "Professor Schoenbaum expects more out of his students than many other professors - he's tough. I think he realizes that the educational system is starting to slip a little, and he's not going to slip with it. His assertion that we're stupid and just part of the MTV generation should be taken as a wake-up call, not as an insult."

Enochian said students have problems in Schoenbaum's classes because they are unwilling to do the amount of work demanded of them.

"If you don't read the readings and do the work, you're going to have problems in any class, especially Schoenbaum's," he said. "We are supposed to be the next genera-

tion of leaders. How is this going to happen when students don't challenge themselves inside and outside the classroom on an everyday basis?"

James Lindberg, associate dean of Academic Programs in the College of Liberal Arts, would not comment on specific complaints against Schoenbaum. He said his office handles student complaints only if they are not resolved by the department head, and so far no complaints against Schoenbaum have come through the College of Liberal Arts this semester.

"Complaints are usually settled within the department, so we get very few," he said. "We have worked with about 12 to 15 students this semester to just inform them about the complaint process. That's much more the function of our office."

Lindberg said if he received an unresolved complaint about Schoenbaum, it would be mediated by an ad hoc committee consisting of two faculty members and one student.

"We haven't had to use such a committee for many years," Lindberg said.

DECISION DISAPPOINTS MANY

Elders' firing expected by UI students, faculty

President Clinton's forced resignation of controversial Surgeon General Joycelyn Elders on Friday didn't come as a surprise to UI students, faculty and staff.

Elders, 61, was ordered to resign after she stirred up controversy at the Dec. 1 World AIDS Day conference in New York, when she advocated masturbation awareness as part of sex education.

The resignation of the nation's top medical officer came as a disappointment to Linda Kroon, program assistant at the Women's Resource and Action Center, 130 N. Madison St.

"Most of the American public have a difficulty talking about sexuality in a direct way, and that's what Elders was doing," she said. "Government officials should be able to say what they mean and to be direct."

Elders' candor was the cause of her downfall, said UI junior and marketing major Jodi Minard. She added that Elders was probably fired after embarrassing the president once too often.

"She had to resign because of her total lack of tact," Minard said. "I think (masturbation) is a pretty controversial issue to speak out on and one that the majority of American parents wouldn't want to be taught."

Faculty members of the UI's political science department said Elders' choice of topics contributed to her termination, aggravating conservatives in the face of an overwhelming Republican victory in November's midterm elections.

Elders' resignation may be evidence that the White House is moving to the political center, said UI political science Associate Professor Cary Covington.

"She was expressing positions that the president felt personally

uncomfortable with and that put his administration in a bad light," he said. "Clinton wants to reclaim the moderate Democratic image of himself that he forged in his 1992 campaign."

The outspokenness of the surgeon general is a phenomenon which began during President Ronald Reagan's administration with Surgeon General C. Everett Koop, said UI political science Assistant Professor Charles Shipan. Ironically, Koop also advocated extremely liberal policies.

"The difference is that Reagan was already seen as so conservative," Shipan said. "If his surgeon general made liberal comments, it wouldn't lead people to think, 'Well, there he goes again.' This is a problem for Clinton."


Elders' resignation may have a

negative impact on future surgeons general, Shipan said.

"What it means is the next surgeon general will be looking over their shoulder a bit more," he said. "The position will remain a bully pulpit of sorts, but my hunch is that it's not going to be occupied by someone who is very liberal."

UI freshman and political science major Brian Macke said Elders' resignation will have a negative impact on public policy.

"My personal feelings are that she had some good ideas," he said. "She was sort of getting us to wake up to the fact that 200 years of puritan ideas aren't necessarily the best way. Personally, I think that children should be taught about all forms of sexuality at an early age because it makes them more open."

CHILE MAY JOIN NAFTA

Trade pact inked at Summit of Americas

MIAMI — Leaders of 34 Western Hemisphere countries signed a free trade declaration Sunday that President Bill Clinton called "a watershed in the history of our hemisphere."

Clinton announced a drive to make Chile the first South American nation to join a free trade pact that now covers the United States, Canada and Mexico.

"This should be evidence that we intend to accelerate the process" of achieving the summit's goal of trade without barriers across the two continents by 2005, Clinton said.

Talks will begin in May to bring Chile into what is now called the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

The Chile announcement, which had been expected, came after Clinton ended the three-day Summit of the Americas, which he said "has more than fulfilled our expectations."

Later, at a news conference — one dominated by domestic and political questions — Clinton defended the summit's failure to take a position denouncing Cuban President Fidel Castro. He said the omission reflected disagreement over how to best foster democracy in Cuba, rather than mixed views on Castro.

"I don't think you should underestimate the depth of feeling throughout Latin America that every coun-

try should be free," Clinton said. "I think the difference is over the best way to achieve that objective. ... There's no agreement on what the policy should be."

Of the hemisphere's 35 nations, Cuba is the only one that is not a democracy. Castro was not invited to the summit.

After the summit closed, Bolivian President Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada announced that his country

would host a November 1996 hemispheric summit on "sustainable development," the pursuit of economic development in harmony with the environment.

Bosnian Serbs stymie U.N. aid effort

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Bosnian Serbs found new ways to thwart U.N. operations on Sunday, effectively stopping humanitarian aid convoys from reaching most of the country.

The Serbs said they would no longer allow U.N. armored personnel carriers to escort aid convoys through the 70 percent of the country they control. Aid workers said they could not work without U.N. protection.

"I think this is just another way of making life difficult for the U.N.," said Lt. Col. Jan-Dirk von Merveldt, a U.N. spokesman in Sarajevo.

The Serbs lifted restrictions on most of the 200 peacekeepers they had been holding hostage, the United Nations said. But they continued harassing U.N. forces in other ways.

A three-truck Danish fuel convoy was hijacked in Bosnian Serb territory Saturday night after gunmen armed with rifles and rocket-propelled grenades blocked the front and rear of the convoy, von Merveldt said.

Also Saturday evening, two Dutch communications vehicles were hijacked along with all of their satellite equipment, von Merveldt said.

"This is an outrageously unacceptable behavior," he said.

The Serbs also refused permission for a plane carrying the U.N. commander in Bosnia, Lt. Gen. Sir

Michael Rose, to land at Sarajevo airport on Sunday. Rose, returning from a failed attempt to visit soldiers trapped in Bihac in northwest Bosnia, landed in Sarajevo anyway, U.N. spokesman Michael Williams said.

There appeared to be little the United Nations could do to stop the Serbs' aggression. The threat of air strikes has been virtually eliminated in a conflict between U.N. diplomats and NATO military planners.

The Serbs have held more than 400 peacekeepers hostage, some for as long as two weeks, as insurance against air strikes. Most of the 200 remaining hostages are no longer restricted and have been allowed to resume their work at weapons collection points, said Lt. Col. Patrick Declery, a U.N. spokesman.

Declery said the only peacekeepers still being restricted were about 40 at the Serb military barracks in Lukavica, outside Sarajevo.

'KEEP THEIR HANDS OFF THE ECONOMY'

Federal Reserve woes

In response to strong economic indicators and a growing economy, the Federal Reserve Board is expected to give the United States an early Christmas present: Chairman Alan Greenspan will meet with Reserve policy-makers Dec. 20 to discuss raising interest rates.

The nation's bank already has raised interest rates six times this year in trying to contain growth, keep prices under control and hold down inflation. This means that — just in time for Christmas and in the final days of retailers' most important season — bank loans and credit card purchases will be more expensive.

Greenspan last week told a congressional committee that the economy is growing across the board and that it's only a matter of time before inflation flares. He said inflation generally follows an economic surge and ignoring that would be taking "unacceptable risks."

It was this type of song and dance that brought about the recession during the Bush administration.

The Federal Reserve has sovereign power and complete control over the interest rates on money it lends to the nation's banks. The Reserve chairmanship has grown to be a position of great power and arrogance. Greenspan sees himself as the great controller of the economy and the nation's growth.

Our free-market economy isn't free. The Federal Reserve takes an active part in when and to what degree our country will grow. To further compound the problem, convolute the solution and corrupt the system, some elected leaders in Washington think they, too, should have a say in the direction and management of the economy.

Congressional Republicans are calling for a capital gains tax cut. They say cutting taxes will stimulate growth in the economy — the economy that Greenspan says is growing too quickly.

If the Republicans are correct, then the economy will grow after a tax cut. If Greenspan is correct, inflation will increase with the growing economy, and he will be forced to increase interest rates yet again. If he increases interest rates, the economy will slow, and Republicans will call for additional tax cuts. Additional tax cuts will spur the economy, and interest rates will climb again, slowing the economy.

It was this type of song and dance that brought about the recession during the Bush administration.

Two weeks ago, President Clinton said that he wouldn't support any measures that would increase the budget deficit and that a tax cut would be difficult at best. Few people understand the budget deficit, and even fewer care, so the president will find few supporters who really want to balance the budget and erase the deficit. In simple terms, tax cuts will reduce the money the government takes in and, without spending cuts, increase the deficit.

If congressional Republicans truly want to help the economy, they will forget tax cuts and let the economy continue to expand. If Greenspan wants to control inflation, he should increase interest rates only after inflation starts to grow.

If Greenspan and Congress want to give the country a Christmas present, they will promise to give up their minor tinkering and keep their hands off the economy.

'Unprofessional and slanderous journalism'

Regarding your story "Student overdoses at Mayflower — Suicide attempt rumored" (*DI*, Dec. 6), I found myself shocked at the seeming ease at which the writer speculated on the motives behind Katie Lehman's so-called overdose. Printing that an individual has attempted to commit suicide is injurious to that person's reputation, as people who have attempted suicide are commonly viewed as psychologically unfit or dangerous by the public. Lehman is a private citizen, and the public does not have the right to pry into her life, especially when it concerns such a private matter as alleged suicide.

Furthermore, there is no definite evidence to suggest that Lehman attempted suicide at all. While most people I know would not consider

In fact, the entire article relies on unsubstantiated speculation, as the *UI* never even made a statement concerning whether this was a suicide attempt or not. In other words, the writer felt it quite reasonable to malign and slander Lehman as suicidal on the mere basis of "rumors" and unsubstantiated hearsay.

I think that the *DI* should immediately make a written statement of apology to Lehman — such unprofessional and slanderous journalism should not be tolerated by the public.

Elders' firing shows cost of executive panic



Too many people are jumping with joy over the fact that President Clinton "finally" demanded the resignation of Surgeon General Joycelyn Elders. Before we get carried away celebrating the Clinton administration's willingness to retreat whenever the GOP elephant stamps its foot, let's look at the incident for which Elders

was asked to leave.

Context: World AIDS Day conference. Place: New York. Date: Dec. 1, 1994. Elders was asked if she felt masturbation is something we should discuss with greater candor in our culture.

The response for which our president fired his surgeon general:

"I think that (masturbation) is something that is a part of human sexuality, and it's a part of something that perhaps should be taught. But we've not even taught our children the very basics. And I feel that we have tried ignorance for a very long time, and it's time we try education."

I have heard more than one person say emphatically that Elders is a lunatic or that she presents herself in a way that makes it easy to label her such; I don't find any objective reason to agree. It looks to me like a combination of cultural schizophrenia, repression and backlash against a very mouthy woman who held an office that requires a mouthy incumbent to be effective.

Anybody who thinks Elders would advocate a "how-to" course in masturbation is an idiot indoctrinated in conservative froth and in need of a good 12-step program. She was saying masturbation is simply one of an entire range of human sexual behaviors, part of what should be

viewed as a complex and unified picture. She was saying we have only harmed ourselves by fragmenting this picture. When we teach bits and pieces of sexuality to our children but omit other pivotal information, we leave them bewildered and susceptible to great harm.

Elders continually spoke against the harms of ignorance. The tone of her speeches was sharp and rightly so, given the tremendous human toll taken when public-health policy is dictated by fear. Elders saw every day what most parents do not have to see: pregnant children, lives messed up and the ignorance that brought it about.

It was ignorance she hoped to combat. But the lucky Americans — the wealthy and white Americans, Americans whose children have access to crisp, freshly laundered information about sexual matters — would not have it. A strong black woman speaking like Harry S. Truman about drug legalization, masturbation and access to abortion was more than they could take.

Rep. Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., called Elders "remarkably destructive." As usual, his pointed words reveal more about the speaker than the target. Elders effectively cut away the type of emotional and superstitious hypocrisy Gingrich will still be clutching like a baby when he's lowered into his grave. And she managed to peel that hypocrisy off topics notoriously coated with an adhesive of controversy: birth control, sexuality, and teaching our children about the pleasures and dangers of the body.

Elders had great respect for youths. Her brother is a preacher, and he preaches abstinence to young people from his pulpit. As her life's work progressed, Elders saw that such preaching wasn't taking hold outside the church building. She knew that more had to be done for the sake of youth, and she fought to do more. She provided access to birth control, information

and instruments; frank talk about AIDS (like C. Everett Koop, the outspoken white male surgeon general who preceded her); and harsh words to Catholics to work against the church hierarchy's "love affair with the fetus." All were long overdue, effective and just what the country needed.

For all the Republican whining, American attitudes about sexuality have never been more hypocritical. Conservative think tanks produce a steady stream of articles and data to prove the failure of sex education. Balderdash. In order to fail, sex education would have to have been given a try; in most places it never was. Here on the edge of 1995, we're so unready for sexual honesty that our president fired the surgeon general for the innocuous statement above.

So have a nice party in the wake of Elders' departure. Be appropriately thankful for the demon's demise at your prayer breakfast, send Gingrich a telegram patting him on the back or call White House operators and say, "Right on, Bill." But don't pretend at the same time to care about the dissemination of important medical information to our children. Don't claim you're not willing to play political or religious games of chance with the lives of poor youths. You can't have it both ways.

Asked if politics had a hand in her dismissal, Elders said, "I'm not enough of a politician to know the answer to that." That simple statement goes a long way toward proving we lost a gem when Elders was sacrificed at the hungry altar of political expediency. She will doubtless be replaced by a smooth politico, and a presence both vibrant and disturbing will be gone from our national conversation about health.

Look carefully before rendering judgments



Poor Michael Douglas. In "Basic Instinct," Sharon Stone seduced him by crossing her legs. Now in "Disclosure," Demi Moore sexually harasses the hapless guy. I guess some people have all the luck.

"Disclosure," which premiered in theaters this weekend, provides an interesting angle on the sexual harassment debate. A salient theme of the movie is that society is too quick to jump to the conclusion that men are automatically the aggressors in sexual harassment. Also, it makes a bold yet truthful statement: Sexual harassment is not about sex, it is about power.

People need to stop and consider how personal power struggles and the desire to further careers affect an alleged charge of sexual harassment. In the real world of dirty office politics, white males are not necessarily the root of all evil.

A quick definition of politics is the process of who gets what, when and how. It deals with what people do vs. what people say. It determines how individuals, pursuing their own interests, interact with their co-workers. This is true not only in the political science department of Schaeffer Hall, but in every aspect of life. "Disclosure" does an excellent job in portraying the power struggle in corporate America.

Niccolo Machiavelli, the originator of dirty politics with "The Prince," would feel quite at home on the set of the movie and approve of the conduct of Demi Moore. Her character, Meredith Johnson, represents a new breed of woman: an aggressive executive who is willing to use every means at her disposal to get what she wants. She is a far cry from the typical distressed woman, fresh from college, who is the victim of some domineering chauvinist pig.

Johnson projects an aura of power and invincibility from the very beginning. Men in the movie drool over her. She is quick to establish her dominance over Tom Sanders (Michael Douglas). The same day she gets Sander's job, she invites him to her office to seduce him and dominate their working relationship.

Johnson's motive is revenge. She had a romantic relationship with Sanders in the past in which he left her, and now she is back to ruin him. She has it all worked out and plans to have her secretary catch Sanders rubbing Johnson's shoulders. Sanders tries to resist her subsequent advances and then leaves. Since Sanders was not about to go along with her fun, Johnson vows to destroy him.

Johnson knows Machiavelli's first rule in gaining power: Learn how not to be good.

When Sanders brings a harassment suit on Johnson, no one believes he was the one being harassed. Sanders reacts like a typical victim of a sexual assault; the details were humiliating to recite, and he is fearful of the consequences

of coming forward. However, he gives a fairly accurate portrayal of the events. Then Johnson takes him down in a poignant, tear-laden sob story about Sanders taking advantage of her.

This demonstrates another Machiavellian dictum: You must be a great liar and hypocrite. He wrote, "Men are so simple of mind, and so much dominated by their immediate needs, that a deceitful man will find plenty who are ready to be deceived."

Sexual harassment is not just the domain of white males of European descent. Sex is a weapon used in power struggles every day, whether it is on the job or at a bar. Both men and women are susceptible to being manipulated in such a manner. Women can play this game just as well, if not better, than men.

Society should look carefully at the situation before rendering any profound judgments of guilt. If it is a case of an entry-level employee being harassed by a superior, it is likely to be true. However, if it involves two equals, it is probably a political power move rather than a true case of harassment.

We should have a healthy case of skepticism until the whole story is told. One person's locker room talk is someone else's harassment.

On Tuesday, Nov. 29, I saw the film presentation of "A Reason to Believe," which was sponsored by the UI lecture series. The major topic of the film was acquaintance rape. A panel discussion followed the film.

There were elements of the event that were very disturbing: The mass exodus at the end of the film before the panel dispelled some of the harmful stereotypes of rape crisis lines that were left unchallenged by the film, and comments during the panel discussion that seemed to let Charlotte's (a character in the film) boyfriend off the hook for his manipulative, unsupportive and aggressive behavior.

From beginning to end, Charlotte's boyfriend was manipulative and controlling. He believed his fraternity brothers' insinuations about Charlotte being the seducer, he raised his fist as if he was going to hit her when he confronted her, and his idea of turning the corner and being supportive was to ask how it felt when the offender was raping her. Near the end of the discussion, a panelist began talking about understanding the boyfriend, how men are not allowed to express their emotions the way women do and equal responsibility in communication. Because it was the end of the discus-

sion, it felt as if the emphasis had shifted off the primary focus of the film to empathizing with or justifying the actions of Charlotte's boyfriend and blaming Charlotte for what happened to her, which is unacceptable.

To all the people that left immediately after the film and may someday need the support of a concerned, non-judgmental individual or group, please do not let the mythology and stereotypes portrayed in "A Reason to Believe" keep you from contacting the Rape Crisis Line of the Rape Victim Advocacy Program. The Rape Crisis Line is a confidential service. The staff of RVAP are well-trained, qualified and committed professionals. All volunteers at RVAP are required to have a minimum of 48 hours of training before they can represent the agency in any capacity. All of the staff and volunteers are required to sign a letter showing they are aware of the consequences of breaking client confidentiality. You will not be "coached" to do something you do not want to do. Your privacy and decision-making will be supported and respected. The staff and volunteers of RVAP are there to provide victims with whatever they need to survive, even if that is just an anonymous, confidential ear.

DI coverage of Jewish holidays not thorough

Given *The Daily Iowan's* treatment of Jewish holidays in the past, we were disappointed with the newspaper's front-page story on Hanukkah titled "Hanukkah illuminates Jewish traditions" (DI, Nov. 29).

As Rabbi Portman emphasized to Devon Alexander, the author of the article, Hanukkah is a minor Jewish holiday. In spite of Portman's comments, the editors decided to print the article on the front page. Meanwhile, the DI has virtually ignored major Jewish holidays. There was no article on Rosh Hashana, which took place on Sept. 6. There was no article on Sukkot or Simchat Torah, which took place between Sept. 20 and Sept. 28. Although there was an article on Yom Kippur, it appeared on the seventh page ("Activity in Israel grinds to halt as Jews prepare for Yom Kippur," DI, Sept. 15). Even then, Yom Kippur was only mentioned because the holiday led to a postponement of the Mideast peace talks. The article was written by an Associated Press journalist, not a DI reporter, and it made no references to the celebration of Yom Kippur in the United States.

We don't doubt that the intentions of the DI staff in running the Hanukkah article were excellent. Christmas can be a difficult time for


Jews because much of the country seems to unite in celebration of the holiday. Your impulse toward inclusion is understandable.

In spite of the editors' kind intentions, however, the DI article only exacerbates the problems for Jews. It gives the comforting illusion of inclusiveness without the substance. Rather than making Jews feel more comfortable, the Hanukkah article merely reassures Christian readers that everyone is celebrating the "holiday season" along with them, and it obscures the fact that the Jewish holiday season (if such a thing exists) finished with Yom Kippur in September. Like so many falsely inclusive ideas, it erases the few but significant cultural and religious differences between Jews and Christians.

We appreciate the good intentions behind the DI's decision to print the Hanukkah article, and we do not mean to discourage you from learning about Judaism or informing DI readers about the religion and culture. We only encourage you to do it in a way that is respectful to Jews. If a rabbi tells you that Hanukkah is a minor holiday, consider the implications of his statement. If you decide to print an article on Hanukkah, cover major Jewish holidays, too, and give them the attention they deserve.





for people to be their chief executive," he said. "When somebody's made a name for themselves, other institutions will notice."

Berenstein said the Cornell appointment was a surprise to him. However, he knew Rawlings had been involved in searches at other institutions, he said.

"I was surprised because I was not aware anything was imminent, but he's been the subject of some searches for the past couple of years. I knew this could happen," he said.

Berenstein said he did not know if Rawlings had applied for the Cornell position or was chosen from a nomination.

Colleagues said Rawlings' decision is unfortunate for the UI.

Hurtig said Rawlings was very

receptive to faculty members, a characteristic that will be important for the next president as well.

"It was an open presidency; the faculty always had easy access to him. He listened to our position, and I think we got a fair hearing," Hurtig said. "Those of us who worked with him got to see him as a colleague and a friend."

Rhodes said she had mixed feelings about Rawlings' decision.

"I'm disappointed that he's leaving, but as his friend, I'm thrilled for him," she said.

The UI will be losing an effective leader and good person when Rawlings steps down, Skorton said.

"I'm certainly sad to see him go, from a selfish point of view. He's been a real good leader," Skorton

said. "He's been just the kind of president to work with as a vice president."

Although Rawlings will leave the UI in June, his name will remain etched in the memories of much of the UI community. Intercollegiate athletics reform, emphasis on research and an ongoing battle with the Campaign for Academic Freedom all characterize Rawlings' years as president.

Fred Mims, associate director of Men's Intercollegiate Athletics, said Rawlings' tough stance on athletics was admirable.

"He's done a fine job in regards to addressing issues in intercollegiate athletics," Mims said. "He has had an active hand, and he'll probably carry that on wherever he goes."

student Leah Klevar.

"Although I haven't agreed with all his policies, such as the 'sex act' policy, I think he's been a vital source on campus," she said. "He seems to care about the students, and in that sense it's going to be a loss."

Rawlings' interactions with students was one of his strongest qualities, said UI graduate student Steve Pattee, a Professional Student Senate executive.

"It always seemed like he tried to be accessible to students," Pattee said. "He'd sit at tables in the dorms during dinners in order to talk to students. He was interested in hearing what students wanted to say."

However, not everyone agreed Rawlings was available to students who had concerns to discuss with him.

UI sophomore Jon Fogarty, a student senator in the Undergraduate Activities Senate, said only "recognized" student leaders had access to Rawlings.

"I never thought he was very accessible to students," Fogarty said. "I think there needs to be more interaction between the president and the students."

Some students were thinking ahead and wondering how Rawlings' resignation would affect the UI.

"The most interesting thing is how it will affect the whole 'sex act' policy

deal," UI senior Scott Darlington said. "It will be interesting to see whether his replacement will have a different take on it."

Pattee said he hopes the next UI president will build on the UI's reputation of showing strong concern for undergraduate education.

"I would like someone who will push undergraduate education and upgrade the teaching," he said.

Fogarty said he welcomes the change and would like the next president to be more personable.

"I would like a president that, if you were the student body president, you could say, 'Let's go to the Deadwood and have a beer,' or just sit down and chat with."

temporary positions, but if an interim president is chosen, an official appointment must be made, whereas an acting president does not require an official appointment.

Berenstein said he would prefer the board find a permanent replacement by July, but if this cannot be accomplished over the next seven months, an acting president should be appointed.

"I'm going to differentiate between having an acting president and appointing an interim," Berenstein said. "It seems that if we're within a short period of time, it would be preferable to have someone act on a temporary basis, rather than making an official appointment."

Rhodes said an interim or acting president would probably be an internal appointment.

She said it was "way too soon" to speculate on potential candidates. However, she did say the search will encompass both UI candidates and

candidates from across the nation.

Berenstein said the search process will involve several steps and will take on a more definite direction after Wednesday's meeting.

"There is going to be a search committee appointed at the university, and they'll hire a firm to do a national search in order to accumulate the names of prospective candidates," he said. "The committee will narrow it down to about 12 names to submit to the regents, and we'll get it down to about six."

The search committee will consist of between 17 and 20 members of the UI community. Rhodes said she expects committee members to be named a few days after the Wednesday meeting.

Rawlings, who is currently in Ithaca, will not attend the Wednesday meeting in Des Moines, Rhodes said.

While no one would speculate on potential presidential candidates, certain qualifications for a UI leader

were noted.

Leadership and commitment to quality education are attributes required of the next UI president, Rhodes said.

"We want someone who has a very good background in different aspects of the university, but particularly teaching, research and service," she added.

Berenstein said he hopes the search will not last more than eight months. The last search the regents conducted was for a new president of Iowa State University, and it lasted about eight months.

More than 200 colleges and universities throughout the United States are currently seeking new presidents or chancellors. Rhodes is confident the UI will find a suitable replacement.

"We have a very successful record of getting outstanding presidents at the UI," she said.

Cyclones storm through Carver

Iowa State's veterans overpower Iowa, 76-63

Four seniors and their new coach invaded Carver-Hawkeye Arena Saturday night and forced the collapse of the Iowa offense.

Iowa State beat Iowa 76-63 and the Hawkeyes fell to 5-1. The Cyclones improved to 6-1.

The Hawkeyes had trouble matching up with the Cyclones' experienced post players, 6-foot-10 forward Loren Meyer, 6-foot-10 forward Julius Michalik, 6-foot-4 forward Fred Hoiberg and 6-foot-5 forward Hurl Beechum.

All four are seniors who have never beat the Hawkeyes in Iowa City. Iowa lost at Hilton Coliseum last season, 86-79.

lik's 20 points. Hoiberg added 15 points and Meyer had 13 rebounds and 14 points. Beechum came off the bench to chip in 16 points in 16 minutes.

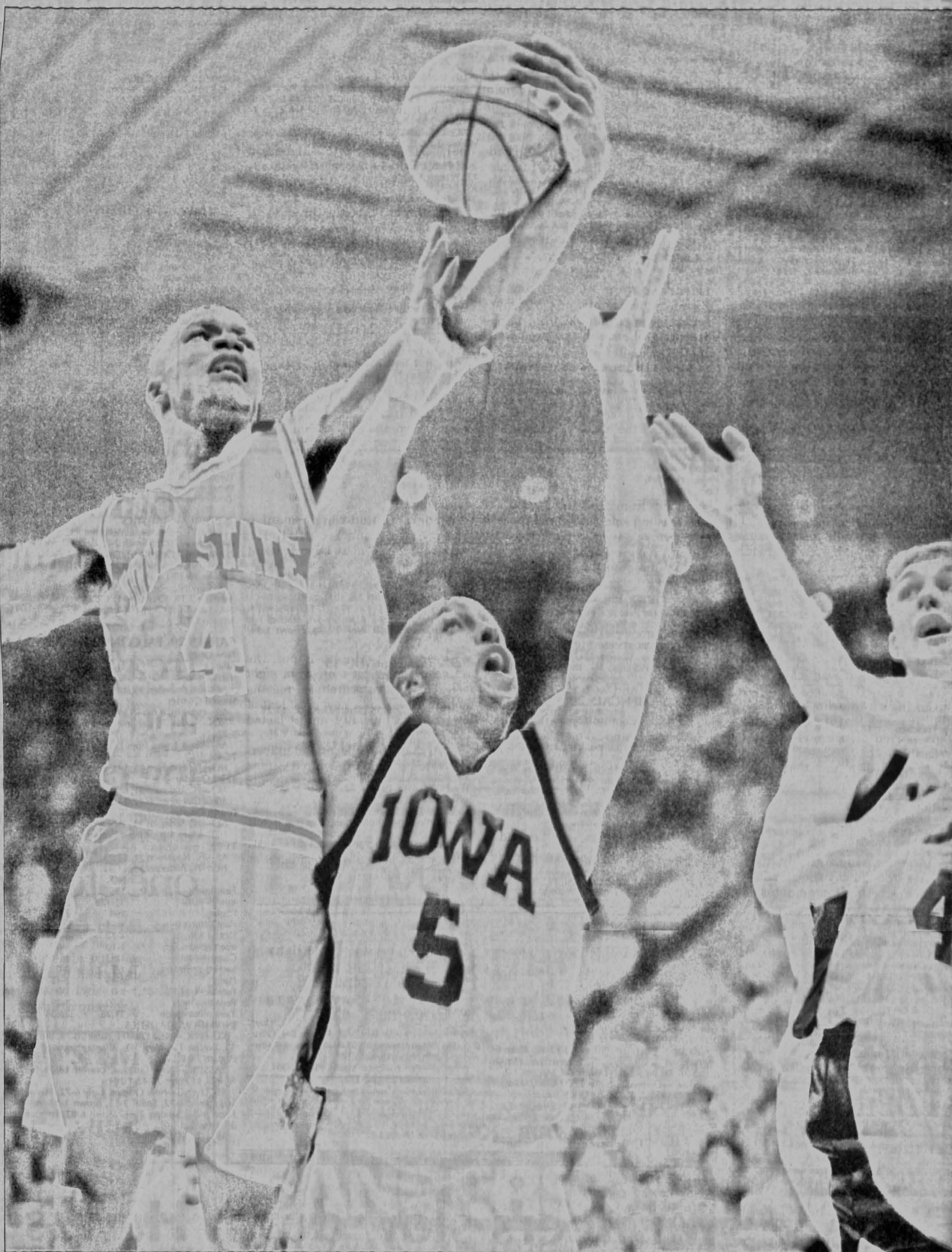
Iowa coach Tom Davis said he knew going into the game that inside matchups would be a problem for the Hawkeyes. The Hawkeyes lack a true center and rely on 6-foot-9 forward Ryan Bowen, 6-foot-7 Jess Settles and 6-foot-6 guard Jim Bartels inside.

"It's just the combination of Michalik, who hurt us in the first half, and Hoiberg, who can hurt you every time you give him room. Then with Meyer anchored in the middle, they're real tough to defend," Davis said.

"They just totally outplayed us tonight," Iowa point guard Andre Woolridge said. "They're just a little more experienced, but we're going to learn from it and practice even harder."

"The seniors just led them. They got the ball inside"

Poor shooting keeps Starks on bench

NEW YORK (AP) — Still dogged by his 2-for-18 shooting disaster in Game 7 of the NBA Finals, Knicks guard John Starks is struggling — and sitting.

Starks' shooting has been so off, he wanted to be taken out of the starting lineup. So coach Pat Riley put him on the bench — and kept him there.

Starks, 37-for-117 over his previous 10 games, didn't play a minute of New York's 107-103 victory over Philadelphia on Saturday night.

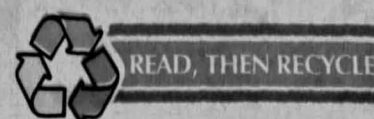
"I didn't think I wasn't going to play," he said. "But that's happened before, so it wasn't weird."

But Starks, who last month signed a \$13.1 million extension through 1999-2000, hadn't missed a game because Riley didn't play him since Nov. 24, 1992.

A scrappy player, Starks worked his way up from the CBA to become an all-star last season. He played a key role in the Knicks' run to the NBA Finals, forcing a Game 7 with Houston by scoring 16 points in the fourth quarter. But his performance in the final game left him to spend the summer mulling the defeat.

Starks is — like the Knicks themselves — finding the going tough this year. Besides his shooting woes, the 6-foot-5 Starks has had trouble stopping taller players on defense and hasn't been drawing fouls.

His frustration reached a peak this week at Atlanta. Starks missed 10 of his 14 shots from the field, and New York lost 89-85.

Iowa wrestling crushes UNI

The Iowa wrestling team remained unbeaten after its 40-4 drubbing of No. 22 Northern Iowa Friday night.

The top-ranked Hawkeyes (3-0) simply overpowered the Panthers (0-2). The Hawkeyes recorded three pins, three major decisions, one match termination, and two decisions in posting nine victories. Friday night's meet also marked the third consecutive dual meet in which Iowa captured nine of 10 matches.

Mike Mena started the rout with his third period pin over UNI's Brent Paulson at 118 pounds.

"I pretty much just stayed on

Fatigue may have been a problem for the Panthers, who suffered through two Iowa comebacks and 45 Iowa takedowns. Kevin Hogan and Curt Heideman both fell

The Cyclones shut down the Hawkeyes' potent offense Saturday, but injuries to Jess Settles may have been more responsible for the low scoring total than Iowa State's defense.

The Big Ten player of the week was limited to a season-low 9 points playing with a sore back and hip in Iowa's 76-63 loss to Iowa State.

"You can get a lot of game adren-

aline in you and take away some of it, but you don't get to practice and you aren't sharp," Settles said. "It's like you're sick and you're a little timid."

Settles came into the game averaging 21.8 points per game with a 56.9 field goal percentage, but the sophomore made only 2 of 9 shots Saturday. A dunk in the first half and a putback after an offensive rebound in the second were his only baskets. He missed all three of his 3-point attempts.

Settles admitted after the game

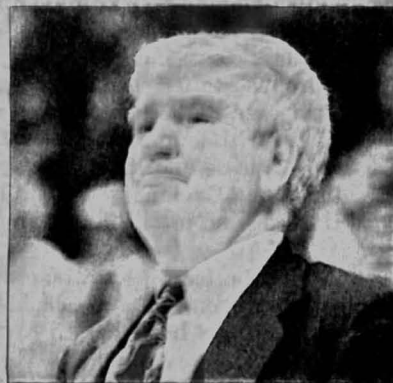
that he is only playing at 50 per cent of his full capacity.

Teams that warm up in December usually find themselves in the NFL playoffs. And Pittsburgh, New England and the New York Giants are hot, hot hot.

The Steelers (11-3), with a 14-3 victory over Philadelphia on Sunday, moved closer to the home-field advantage throughout the playoffs with their sixth straight win.

The Patriots and Giants, meanwhile, boosted their playoff hopes with victories.

Even Tampa Bay got in on the act, winning its third straight for the first time in 12 years but still getting knocked out of a postseason shot.

Andre Hastings and John L. Williams scored touchdowns 1:48 apart in the fourth quarter to lead the Steelers, who on Sunday played Cleveland (10-4) for the AFC Central title.

The Browns, who beat Dallas on Saturday, clinched a playoff spot Sunday.

"This defense wants to go to the Super Bowl," defensive end Ray Seals said after the Steelers held the Eagles to 105 total yards.

Pittsburgh's defense held Randall Cunningham to a career-low 59 yards passing (9 of 27) at Three Rivers Stadium.

Patriots 28, Colts 13
At Foxboro, Mass., the playoff-starved Patriots (8-6) got two TD passes from Drew Bledsoe for a 28-13 victory over the Indianapolis Colts.

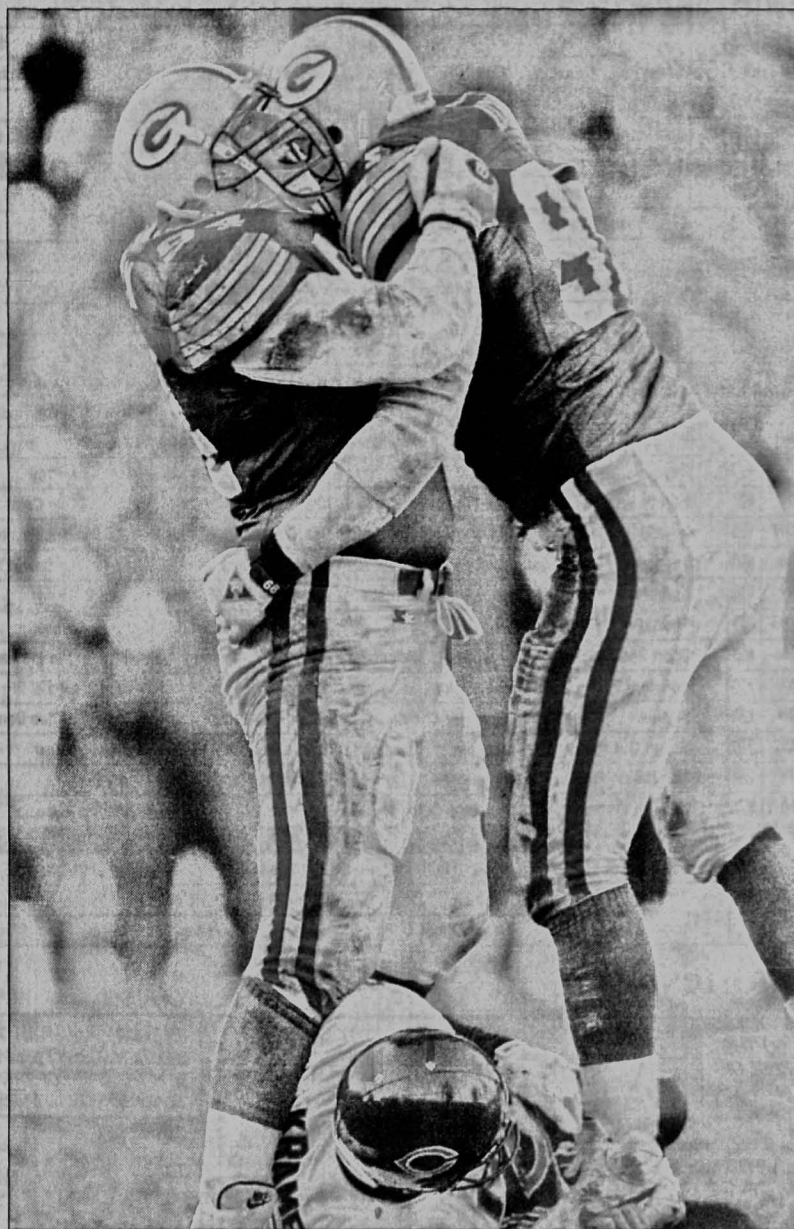
The Pats can move into a first-place tie with Miami in the AFC East if the Dolphins lose to Kansas City tonight.

Despite four interceptions, Bledsoe completed 25 of 45 passes for 277 yards to push the Pats closer to their first playoff berth since 1986.

The Pats held Marshall Faulk, the AFC's No. 3 rusher, to 50 yards on 17 carries.

Giants 27, Bengals 20
At East Rutherford, N.J., Rodney Hampton scored his second TD from 3 yards out with 40 seconds left to lift the Giants (7-7) to their fourth straight victory — 27-20 over Cincinnati. The Giants probably have to win their final two games — against Philadelphia and Dallas — to make the playoffs.

Warren Moon (21 of 34 for 261 yards) finally won in Buffalo after six tries in 10 years as Minnesota (9-5) moved into sole possession of first-place in the NFC Central.

Fuad Revez had five field goals — 30, 38, 30, 25 and 22 yards — and Cris Carter caught nine passes for 111 yards to move within a catch of tying Sterling Sharpe's single-season NFL record of 112.

Packers 40, Bears 3
Chicago (8-6) never had a chance as Brett Favre threw three TDs — two to Sterling Sharpe — Chris Jacke added four field goals and the Packers (7-7) won their ninth straight game at Lambeau Field.

The Bears lost their 14th straight December road game, a streak that dates to Dec. 7, 1987.

Favre completed 19 of 31 passes for 250 yards and Edgar Bennett had 106 yards on 22 carries as the Packers snapped a three-game losing streak and kept their playoff hopes alive.

49ers 38, Chargers 15
The 49ers won their ninth straight Sunday, surviving a mid-game letdown to beat the San Diego Chargers and put themselves a game from clinching everything they can own in the regular season.

Steve Young was 25-for-32 for 304 yards and threw for two touchdowns.

San Francisco's Deion Sanders had a 90-yard interception return with 32 seconds left.

Cardinals 17, Redskins 15
Greg Davis kicked a 27-yard field goal on the last play of the game Sunday to lift Coach Buddy Ryan's Cardinals to a victory.

After the Redskins took a 15-14 lead with 2:54 left on Chip

Lohmiller's 21-yard field goal, Jay Schroeder led the Cardinals (7-7) to the winning score starting from the Arizona 30-yard line.

Raiders 23, Broncos 13
Jeff Jaeger kicked a team-record five field goals and Denver failed to get touchdowns twice after first downs at the Los Angeles 1 as the Raiders downed the Broncos.

The Raiders (8-6) have beaten the Broncos (7-7) five straight times, 11 of the last 12 and eight in a row at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

Seahawks 16, Oilers 14
Chris Warren, involved in an auto accident that paralyzed teammate Mike Frier on Dec. 2, rushed for a career-high 185 yards on 30 carries and scored on a 33-yard run.

The Oilers (1-13), trying to regroup under new coach Jeff Fisher, lost their 10th straight game and looked bad doing it — until they scored twice in the final 4:23 of the fourth quarter.

NHL

Governors to decide next move in lockout

The wait is on.

With a lull in the NHL labor talks, everybody is waiting until today to see what the league's braintrust decides about the remainder of the season.

League governors will be in New York for an emergency meeting to determine what the next move will be in the lockout, which entered its 72nd day Sunday.

What appears likely is that owners will give commissioner Gary Bettman a deadline to work out a deal, and that date will likely fall within a week from today.

"I think the vote will be 100 percent to keep talking," said Boston Bruins president Harry Sinden. "There is a group that might want to pull the plug right away and another that feels we should give and take whatever they give us."

"Both groups at the extremes aren't big. My feeling is the board wants to keep talking until we've run out of time ... In my opinion, the board will say (to Bettman), 'It's not good enough. See if you can keep going and get it to the point where we can accept it.'"

The NHL and NHL Players Association were close to agreement on three main issues — free agency, salary arbitration and a rookie salary cap — when the league brought out a 25-percent payroll tax which derailed negotiations last Tuesday in Chicago.

As of Saturday, there had been no verbal communication between NHL commissioner Bettman and union boss Bob Goodenow since the talks broke down. However, there was an exchange of letters Thursday and Friday between the two main negotiators.

Dallas Stars general manager Bob Gainey thinks a deal can be worked out.

"I think there's still optimism that they're willing to work toward a settlement," he said. "It looks like there is a framework there to work through."

"The difference between what the owners are offering and where the union is on these issues is not significant," said Stars president Jim Lites.

The big question is whether owners will remove the tax, and it doesn't appear likely.

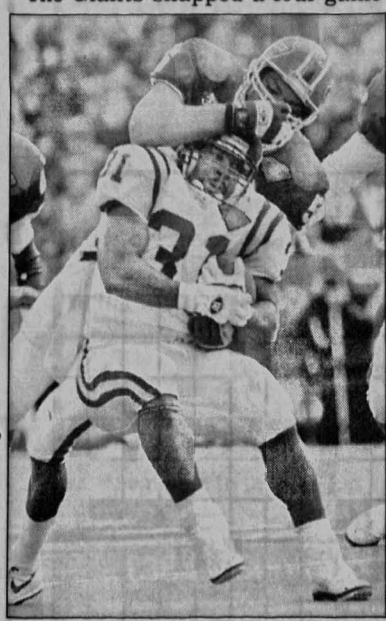

GRAND SLAM CUP

Larsson receives early Christmas gift

MUNICH, Germany — It is unlikely that things will get a whole lot better on the tennis court for Magnus Larsson, but that's not bad.

One week after helping Sweden take the Davis Cup title, Larsson upset top-ranked Pete Sampras to win the richest prize in tennis — \$1.5 million.

Larsson won 7-6 (8-6), 4-6, 7-6 (7-5), 6-4 in the final of the Grand Slam Cup, at \$6 million the most lucrative tennis tournament in the world.

"This is the best Christmas present I could get," Larsson said.

Larsson nearly equaled his career prize money of \$1,690,317, and more than doubled his 1994 earnings, which had stood at \$639,105 before the final.

The economic news wasn't bad for Sampras, either.

The American, who won the inaugural Grand Slam Cup in 1990, earned \$750,000, plus a bonus of \$500,000 for the two Grand Slam titles he won in 1994 — the Australian Open and Wimbledon.

By adding \$1.25 million to his 1994 earnings, Sampras reached the record sum of \$4,857,812 for a year. The money here also boosted

the career earnings for the two-time Wimbledon champion more than \$16 million.

The tournament invites 16 players with the best records in the four Grand Slam events, which also include the French and the U.S. Opens.

Larsson, who had never beaten Sampras in five previous matches, made the tournament by virtue of reaching the semifinals at the French Open, his best career finish at a Grand Slam event. He is ranked 19th in the world.

But Larsson went up 40-0 on his serve, and a service winner gave him the match after 2 hours, 37 minutes.

"At the start of the fourth set I had a few good games, but at the end I felt a bit tired, the pressure was on me," Larsson said. "But I saw that Pete was also tired and I thought that the longer the match lasts, the better my chances."

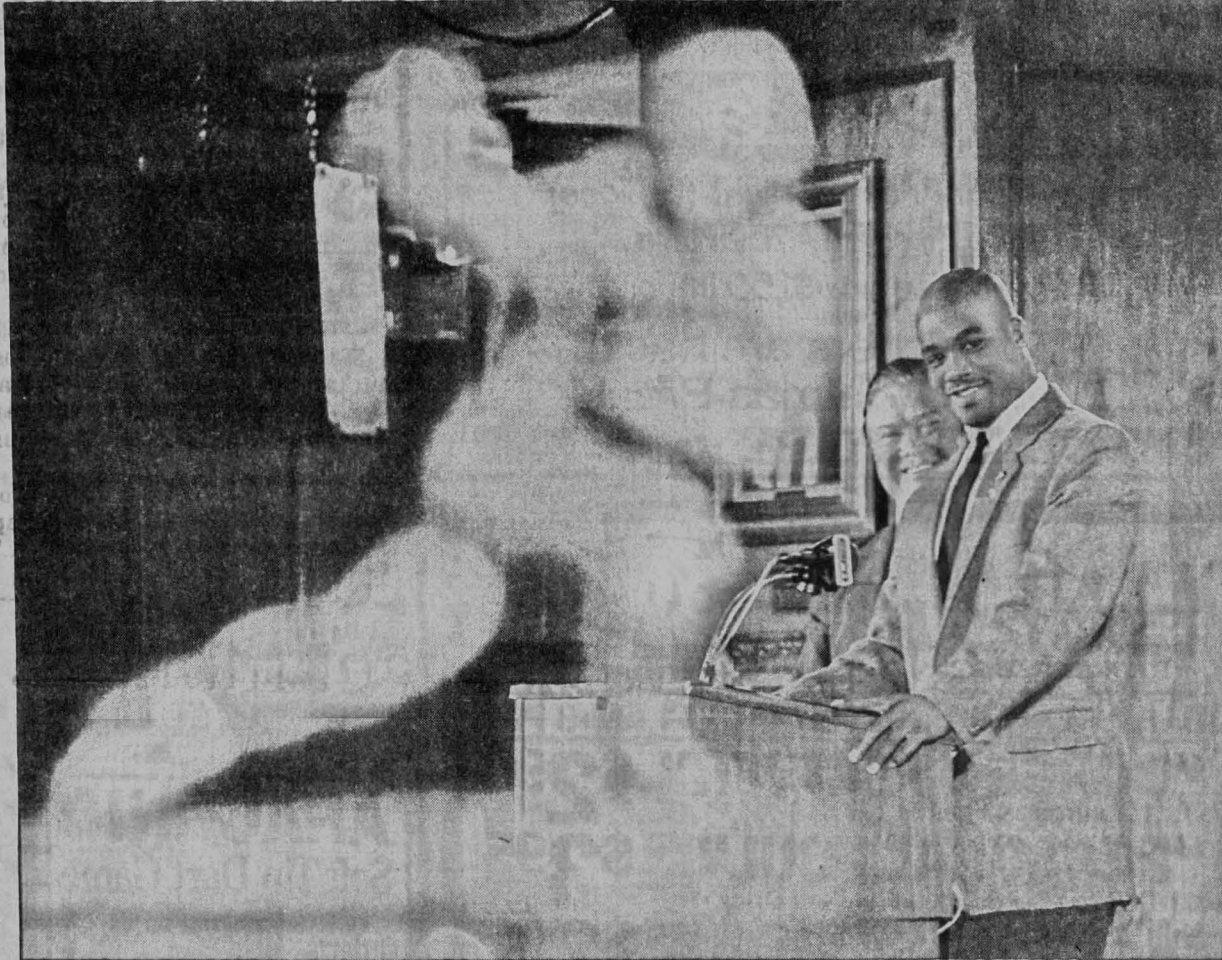

In reaching the final, Larsson upset three higher-ranked players — Stefan Edberg, Andre Agassi, and Todd Martin in the semifinals.

Sampras won 10 titles this year, the last one at the ATP Tour World Championship in Frankfurt in November.

But he could not match the raw power of Larsson, who hit 31 aces.

A winner of two titles this year, Larsson broke Sampras twice in the final set to take a 5-1 lead. He wasted a match point and was broken in the eighth game, allowing Sampras to cut the lead to 5-4.

Salaam runs away with Heisman

NEW YORK — All season long, Rashaan Salaam has placed team goals over individual achievements. So his reaction to winning the Heisman Trophy wasn't surprising.

"I'm honored that I won the award, but I'd trade it for a win over Nebraska in a second," the Colorado tailback said. "I would love to be playing for a national championship right now."

Nebraska handed Colorado its only defeat of the season. If the Buffaloes had won that game, they would be playing for the national title in the Orange Bowl instead of Nebraska.

Instead, they're going to meet Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 2. Four days later, Salaam will announce whether he'll enter the NFL draft or return for his senior season.

"I've already made my decision," he said Saturday night during the Heisman ceremony at the Downtown Athletic Club. "But I'm not

going to announce it until Jan. 6 because I want to concentrate on the Fiesta Bowl."

Salaam, the nation's leading rusher and scorer, is the 12th junior to win the Heisman. Four of the last five junior winners skipped their final year of eligibility to turn pro.

"I believe getting a diploma is important," said Colorado coach Bill McCartney, who is leaving his job after the Fiesta Bowl. "Making all that money doesn't make a man happy. But I'm not going to advise Rashaan what to do."

Whatever decision Salaam makes, McCartney will keep track of his career.

"I'm going to watch him whether he's playing at Colorado or playing on Sundays in the NFL," McCartney said. "He's as good as any back I've ever been around."

Salaam thanked his teammates, family and coaches.

"I feel blessed, but I'm not going to let it change my life," he said. "I'm 20 years old and I'm still going to do the things that young guys do."

Salaam got almost twice as many votes as the runner-up, tailback Ki-Jana Carter of Penn State. Alcorn State quarterback Steve McNair finished third and Penn State quarterback Kerry Collins was fourth.

Carter and Collins are the first teammates to finish in the top five since Nebraska's Mike Rozier and Turner Gill in 1983.

"I think it's great that we both did so well, but I'm sure playing on the same team made it harder for us to win," Collins said.

Collins, who led Division I-A in passing efficiency, said he was proud to be recognized as one of the best players in the country.

"I can say I was a Heisman finalist, and there's not too many people in the world that can say that," he said.

Miami tackle Warren Sapp finished sixth, the only defensive player in the top 10. No one-way defensive player has won the Heisman.

"I see the trophy has a ball," Sapp said. "You have to have the ball to win it."

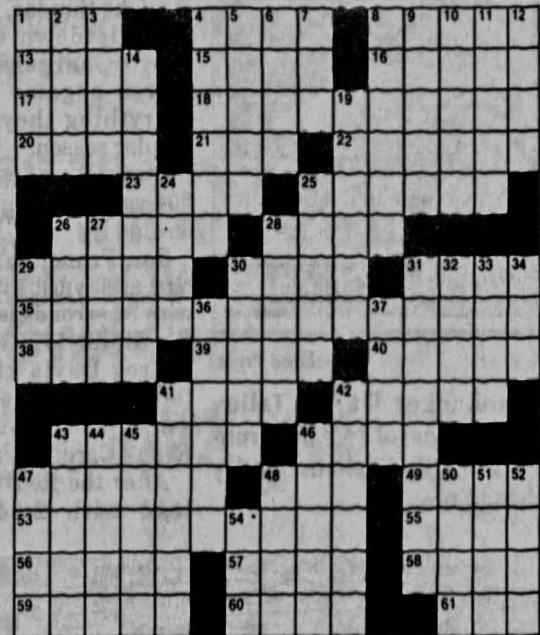

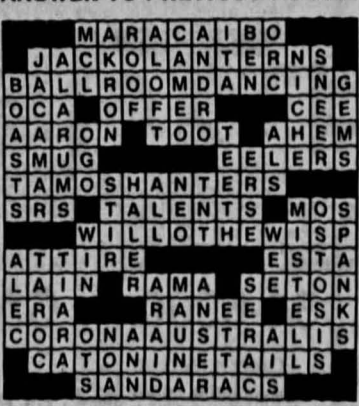

"We saw for the first time this year, our inside guys play with an all out purpose on the defensive board and defensively," Floyd said. "We really, really played a tremendous game on Settles all night long. I thought that was one of the biggest keys."

Down the stretch, Iowa couldn't run its offense effectively and forced its shots.

The Hawkeyes scored two field goals in the first six minutes of the second half as the Cyclones pulled away a 40-32 lead with 13:55 left in the game.

Settles sank a pair of free throws at 12:53 to cut Iowa State's lead to seven points, but the Hawkeyes would get no closer.

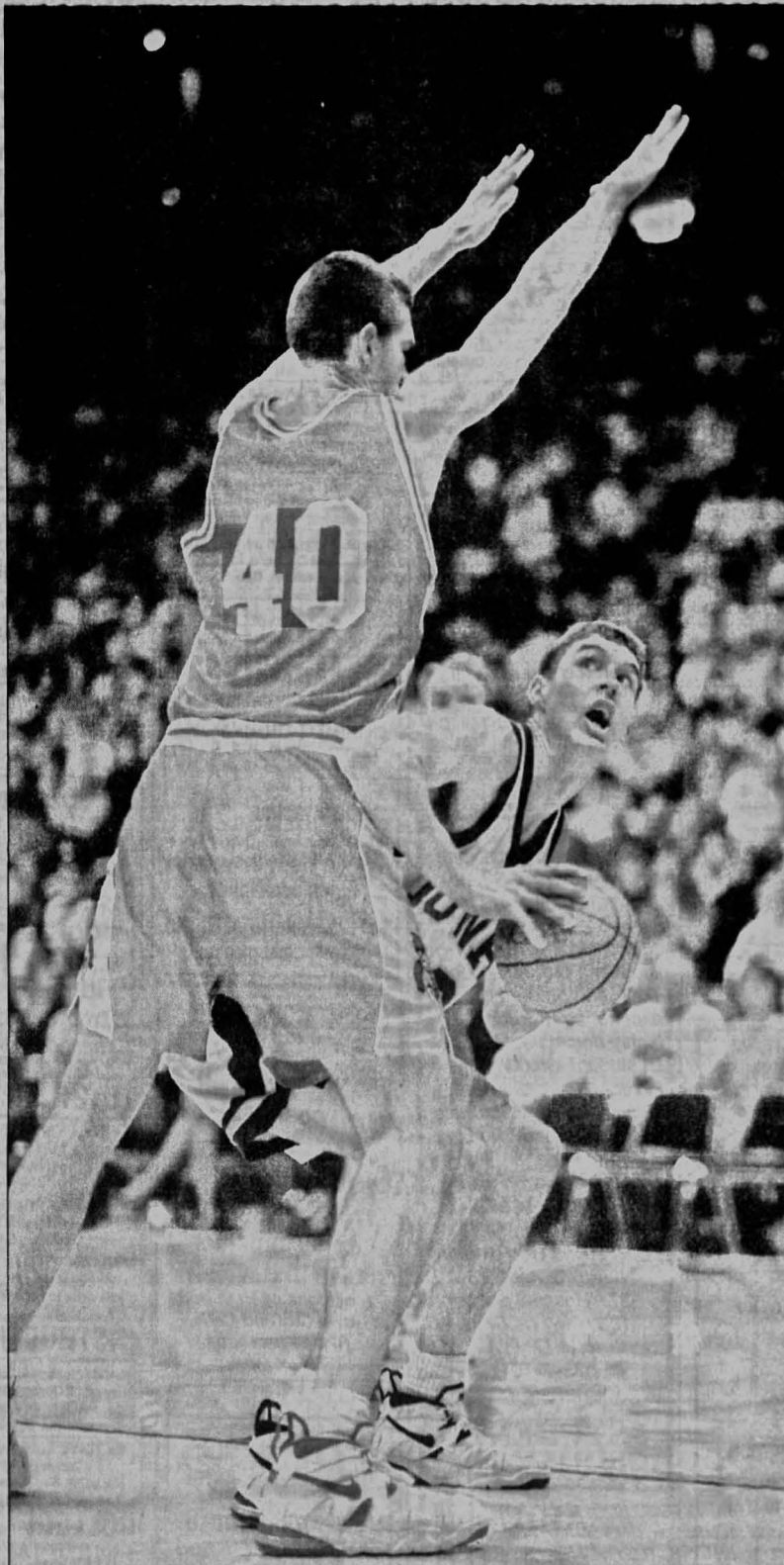
Hoiberg had three 3-pointers in the second half and Beechum hit two.

lik picked up the bulk of the Cyclone offense, scoring Iowa State's first eight points.

Iowa built a 19-13 lead on a pair of 3-pointers by Kingsbury, but the Hawkeye pressure defense couldn't contain the Cyclones.

"Against the press, you can't panic," Hoiberg said.

"It will take three or four seconds, but if you get a five-second call, big deal. It's better than a turnover. That's the key, staying poised."

BASEBALL STRIKE

RYE BROOK, N.Y. — Baseball owners removed their escalating payroll tax Sunday and replaced it with a flat tax that the players claimed would act like a salary cap.

Management negotiator John Harrington said the plan was a "substantial move" by the owners, who received the union's latest proposal just 27 hours earlier. The plan also has provisions for a secondary tax that owners said would ensure salaries don't escalate.

It didn't seem as if the day's bargaining produced progress, but owners said their plan embraced some of the union's ideas on future joint ventures.

"They offered us some very interesting, enlightened concepts yesterday that seemed to have opened the door to a partnership," Atlanta Braves president Stan Kasten said. "We think it behooves us to go through that door."

Union head Donald Fehr said his side needed time to analyze the plan but his initial reaction wasn't positive.

"It appears to be all the elements of a cap," he said.

Even as they offered the new plan, owners said their salary cap proposal of June 14 remained on the table. Management negotiators asked the union to respond within 24 hours, and reminded the union there is a meeting of all owners scheduled for Thursday in Chicago.

Harrington has said previously that owners will declare an impasse and impose a salary cap unless an agreement is reached by then. A management lawyer, speaking on condition he not be identified, said general managers were sent a packet of material Nov. 28 detailing how baseball's rules would change following the imposition of the cap.

Fehr said the union will respond to the proposal only when it fully understands the proposal, but said his group will try to have an answer by Monday.

"If (the owners) need to rush off to their meeting, then they'll do whatever they do," Fehr said.

After receiving the proposal, union officials and players met around a large table in an atrium dining area of an executive conference center. Fehr, in contrast to his business suit of Saturday, was in a bright pink sweater.

Owners said the plan for a sort of two-tiered tax showed significant movement. Their previous tax proposal, made Nov. 17, called for an escalating rate that would have gone as high as 77 percent using 1994 figures.

"I don't know what to make of it," one union lawyer said of the plan. "It's bizarre."

Management didn't detail its plan. However, a source speaking on the condition he not be identified said it proposed a 4.64 percent tax designed to raise \$35 million.

The union on Saturday proposed a 5.02 percent tax that would apply to all clubs and raise \$49 million. Management's proposal, the source said, would apply only to clubs with payrolls more than 112 percent of the industry average.

"I just got a little combo package right now in there," Settles said. "I maybe should have taken off the UNI game, but you don't want to take it off when you're on a roll. It might not even have made a difference today. They played really well."

Cyclone forward Julius Michalik, known more for his perimeter shooting than his defensive prowess, guarded Settles one-on-one for much of the game.

"I tried to stop his penetration from outside because after he missed a couple shots at the beginning of the game, he wasn't very confident with his outside shot," Michalik said.

Michalik said Iowa State coach

Tim Floyd challenged him in practice to step up his defense for Settles.

"He was telling me he didn't think I could play in this game because Jess Settles was player of the week in the Big Ten," Michalik said. "I took his challenge and I tried to do my best today on Jess Settles."

Although he complimented Michalik for his defense, Floyd said he was aware Settles was not in sync.

"Jess missed a couple open shots. Guys have nights like that some times, but he's one terrific competitor," Floyd said. "He was still fighting it there at the end."

Settles' low scoring output was indicative of the all the Hawkeyes.

Iowa shot 31.3 percent from the field, 23.8 from beyond the 3-point

arc. That's a far cry from the 50 and 42.1 season percentages Iowa had going into the game.

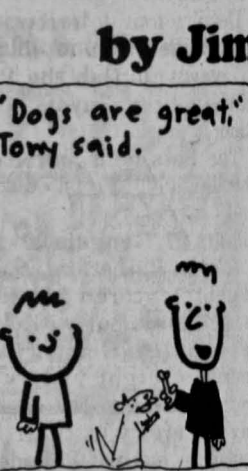
"It is significant when (Settles) can't get going because it kind of stymies everything else because so much of our offense feeds off of him," forward Kenyon Murray said.

Iowa doesn't play again until Saturday when it meets Long Island at Carver-Hawkeye Arena, giving Settles some much needed time to heal.

"When you win it's easy to say what you're feeling. When you lose you don't want to use it as an excuse," Settles said. "I got a week off here. I'll try to get better. It just wasn't there today."

"It's all part of athletics. You don't want it to happen but it happened and I'll try to get around it."

The movie is just what its title implies. It's a comedy with recycled jokes, an action film with very little action and a protagonist lifted straight out of the 1970s "blaxploitation" flicks which Wayans has so successfully parodied before. It all emerges in "Shame" as a labori-

ous and overdone rerun of a concept with enough clichés left over to fashion two extra seasons of the corniest daytime drama. It's a shame. Andre Shame (Wayans) is the proverbial down on his luck private detective. A former cop who let one of his suspects get the better of him, Shame has been reduced to "suicide jobs" just to pay the rent. But along comes an old police buddy, Rothmiller (Charles S. Dutton), who offers Shame the chance to avenge himself against his old nemesis and rediscover what it was that made him a supercop so long ago.

If that sounds like old hat, don't worry — it gets worse. Shame goes on to meet an old girlfriend who's just sexy enough to be appealing in spite of her bitchiness. He raids his old wardrobe for an outfit which is apparently from his days with the police, although it makes him look like a refugee from an old "Soul Train" episode. And finally, he hops into a slick sports car which has been hiding under a tarp the entire film, so as to discourage any audience speculation about how a down-and-out private eye could possibly afford such a vehicle. "Shame" is full of holes like these, which makes it hard to take the film seriously.

Wayans himself is to blame, having written and directed this mess. As an actor and comedian, he still has undeniable presence, but his writer / director alter ego didn't take the time to separate the parody from the serious stuff. The jokes are all redressed gags from old "Good Times" episodes. The action sequences can be found in any one of a thousand nameless B-movies. Even in his casting calls, Wayans is off the mark.

Charles S. Dutton is severely miscast as Shame's traitorous turncoat buddy Rothmiller. Dutton is the wizened and insightful type of actor (see him in "Alien 3") with an occasional oafish tendency thrown in for good measure (see the Fox TV sitcom "Roc"). Pouring him into a role like this is like casting Mickey Rooney as Judas Iscariot — it just doesn't work.

Wayans' biggest problem is that he put on a hat that could never fit him. "A Low Down Dirty Shame" might have made a successful parody, like Wayans' directorial debut, "I'm Gonna Get You Sucka."

Instead, parody takes a back seat to some serious issues that are treated with carelessness and a lack of attention to detail. Creativity and freshness are abandoned to the whims of action film clichés.

The result of Wayans' poor decisions is a weird hybrid of a farce that can't really decide where to go.

Year-end dance concert shows off range of talent

When dance students are showing their pieces, the audience knows they will see dancing and choreography running a gamut of styles, moods and abilities. That is exactly what the "Space / Place Plus Concert" delivered Saturday night.

The concert, which was a performance of previously adjudicated and choreography class works, definitely had its high and low points.

The high points of the evening usually involved Jing Hong Kuo, who choreographed two pieces and danced in three. A talented dancer with a sense of the unusual and spiritual in her choreography, Kuo was the highlight of the show.

Kuo's self-choreographed solo, displayed the most innovative movements of the night. Making her entrance astride a chair and holding another over her head like a canopy, Kuo danced in her "Vanquish ... ?" with intensity and emotion as she used her chairs as seats, shelter and a jungle gym. Costumed in what looked like a white sheet wrapped around her body and adorned with colorful body paint, Kuo was interesting to watch and was a good example of technical precision mixed with emotional fire.

The show also featured two pieces based on children's stories. While both were entertaining and fun to watch, they were the kinds of dances that people who don't like dance enjoy because they tell a recognizable tale.

"Pigmedley," a takeoff on "The Three Little Pigs," was the more enjoyable of the two. The best part of this piece was the surprising presence of Assistant Professor Lin-

da Crist as the pig with the house made of straw.

As with any show of student works, the performance contained some rough spots.

One of the night's most confusing pieces was Joanna Rosenthal's "Untitled." Her sudden change in music from Mozart to The Beastie Boys was too much of a surprise, since she didn't elaborate on the initial point of the piece, that of people (assumedly students) gossiping and alienating one another. Had she stayed with the piece's original idea, the dance would have worked much better and would have better utilized the talents of her six dancers — especially Sarah Brewster, who managed to hand in a good performance despite "Untitled" 's choppyness. Brewster was also excellent in Kuo's "Sacrament."

Also disappointing was Rachel Duda's "Sea of Love." Again, a good idea was not fully developed. The dance told a good initial story of two women in love (danced by Kuo and Joanna Rosenthal), but the shortness of the song didn't give Duda much liberty. This was a case of music choice dictating the choreography, and Duda should have looked a little further to find better music. The piece was well-danced but could have been much more than the two-minute teaser it was.

Space / Place concerts are a chance for young dancers and choreographers to get their work in front of an audience when they otherwise might not have a chance. Although not a perfect show by any means, this semester's concert displayed the UI dance department's up-and-coming talent and cemented the reputations of some of the department's major players.
