## NEARING THE END

### TESTIMONY IN JUNIOR COURT CASES ALL IN

Rev. Jackson says Olivia Primrose was Romantic—Noel Last Witness for Steyne

No session of the junior court was held this morning. This afternoon both cases were on, and nearly all the evidence has been introduced.

#### SENTIMENT AGAINST CRAWLEYS

The testimony given by Noel has placed the Crawleys in a bad light. It revealed so many things that public sentiment has rather turned against them.

#### KECK NOT STRONG WITNESS

W. L. Keck the last witness for the plaintiff in the Primrose case failed to strengthen their case. He knew little of the affair at issue and could only testify to the general reputation of both parties.

#### OLIVIA WILLING TO MARRY

The defense in Primrose vs. Thornhill have introduced as their witnesses, A. E. Miller clerk of the local court, Rev. Jackson a brother clergyman of Dr. Primrose, and C. E. Coakley a neighbor of the Primroses. The evidence of all these witnesses tended to prove that Olivia willing entered into the marriage relation, and that every form of the law had been complied with. The only question was as to the willingness of the defendant.

#### OLIVIA ROMANTIC

Undoubtedly the clearest evidence upon the relations of the parties to this suit, was that given by Rev. Jackson, who was on the most intimate terms with the family. He told of the vicar's peculiar views on religion and marriage of his intense hatred for the Roman Catholic forms. He told of the scheming of Mrs. Primrose to make a catch for her daughters. "Olivia," said the witness, "was of a very romantic disposition, she held many of her father's views, especially those relating to marriage." The witness then told of the family picture, too big for the house, and of Lord Thornhill being included in the picture.

#### No Teacher's Examinations

State Superintendent Barret will recommend to the State Teachers Association that the state no longer hesitate to authorize the superintendent of public instruction or the state educational board of examiners to grant without examination, a certificate to teach in any public school to any person holding a diploma of graduation from the State University of Iowa, the advanced course of the State Normal, or any other educational institution approved by the examiners.

## NEW RACING SHELL

### HARVARD TO HAVE AN EIGHT-OAR

Nineteen 'I's' Given at Illinois—Minnesota Will Play California New Year's Day

The Athletic association at Cornell university has decided to built racing shells as a commercial enterprise, and will undertake to meet all demands for boats. A skilled boat builder has been engaged and a regular shop will be opened. There is at present a large demand for Cornell boats. Harvard has agreed to purchase a new eight-oared shell for her 'varsity race against Yale next spring, and the University of Washington has agreed to purchase a new eight-oared shell. This is the first time an American college association has undertaken such an enterprise.

It has been authoritatively announced at California that the Varsity will play Minnesota's eleven on New Year's day on the Richmond grounds in San Francisco.

By the arrangement agreed upon between the two Universities, Minnesota will bring twenty men to the Coast, and will have all the expenses of the trip paid by the local management out of the gate receipts.

Nineteen men were awarded the right to wear the football emblem at the meeting of the Athletic Board of Control Friday at Illinois.

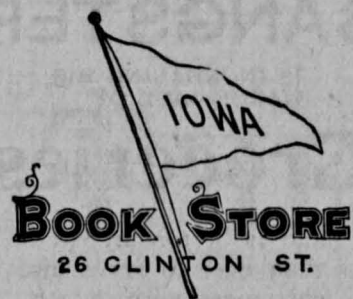

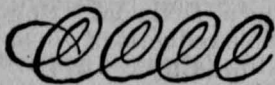


