CONVENTION OF GRADUATE CLUBS

NINTH ANNUAL CONVENTION DECEMBER 29-30

Meeting to be Held at Radcliffe—Herder Anniversary—German Plays at Harvard

The ninth annual convention of the Federation of Graduate Clubs of America will be held at Radcliffe College on December 29 and 30. Delegates will attend the convention from Yale, Columbian University, and many colleges in the west. It is not yet known who will represent Harvard at the meeting.

The German department of Northwestern University, assisted by official delegates from various German organizations, commemorated the one hundredth anniversary of the death of Johann Herder with exercises in Lunt Library Friday evening.

The Deutscher Verein of Harvard will give Lauf's "Pension Schollar" next March. The Cercle Francais of the same name school presents "Le Barbier de Seville" December 17.

GRIFFITH IS CERTAIN

OTHER ATHLETIC UNION CANDIDATES ANXIOUS

Kunz-Walker-Oelkers-Griffith Ticket Opposed by Siberts-Hampson-Barker-Griffith

Dwight M. Griffith, the varsity quarterback, is the only candidate for athletic union offices who is certain of victory.

Both of the tickets now out have him as their candidate for secretary.

The other candidates are on the anxious seat J. F. Kunz, L. '05, who has been Acting President of the athletic union this fall, is opposed for the presidency of the union by Frank L. Siberts, of the Senior Medical Class Henry G. Walker L. '05, and Hampson L. '05, are up for vice-president. Roy Oelkers '05, who has been assistant-treasurer Willet's assistant this year, is opposed for assistant-treasurer by E. J. Barker L. '06.

The Kunz-Walker-Oelkers-Griffith ticket was the only one nominated as provided by the constitution of the Union. An amendment providing for oral nominations was proposed at the last meeting of the union and referred to a committee by a practically unanimous vote. This amendment makes possible the consideration of the Siberts-Hampson-Barker-Griffith ticket.

The election will take place Wednesday night. Both tickets are generally conceded to be composed of excellent men. Judged by the last meeting of the union, the chances are brightest for the success of the Siberts-Hampson-Barker-Griffith ticket.

Post-Season Football

Let any sport become popular with the masses and there at once tends to be an intense rivalry that soon goes beyond mere love of sport and becomes an effort to win money, cups, medals, and fame. It is then that professionalism creeps in.

The one game, which has remained essentially a true sport under all most all conditions, is football. This from the beginning has been an essentially Anglo-Saxon school sport. Differing from cricket it has not been a local sport.

In spite of the popularity of the game it is still lacking professionalism as compared with baseball. Baseball is in reality a national game and only incidentally a school sport.

From the beginning football has been so popular that there has been a continual fight between the professionals and the amateurs. The latter have invariably won, but only by clearly defining the rules which shall govern the sport. Some of those rules, as the Thanksgiving game have become college traditions. To overstep them seems unnecessary, and even dangerous.

The professionals failing in other lines are trying the post-

season plan. This if in moderation will probably work no harm. But, who can say where it will end. Post-season can easily be made all-year-season.

College sport should be sport only. It is a necessary part of college life but let it be a sport, that still remains sport, win or lose.

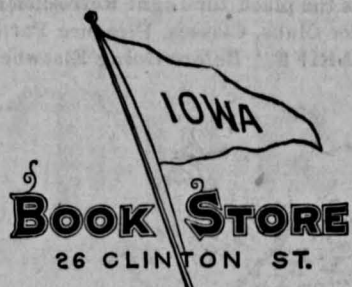
