## WOMAN'S BUILDING

### MINNESOTA CO-EDS TO ERECT ONE

#### Statistics of Attendance at Universities—Simpson Co-eds on a Musical Tour

The Woman's League at the University of Minnesota is endeavoring to procure sufficient funds to erect a Woman's building on the campus. The building would be used for a girls club house, where meals would be served, and a place of meeting offered to all women students. If the plans are successful and the building erected the club-house will be the place where social events will take place, and will be made the center of women's activity.

The announcement of the approaching marriage of Charles A. Pell, coach of the track and football teams of the State Normal, brings to an end a two year romance. Pell while still a student at Drake was employed as track trainer for the teams of the state institution.

During the spring he was requested by the young women to help them in their preparation for the spring meet. Miss Etta Merner was easily the best of the contestants and received the lion's share of the attentions of the trainer.

When the hundred yard dash was called and Miss Merner won in eleven seconds flat, two seconds better than the purported world's record for women, she captured the heart of her trainer as well, and the wedding bells are scheduled to ring right merrily December 29.

Vassar College is not yet a half century old, dating from 1861. Wellesley, Smith, and Radcliffe have existed only a quarter of a century. Bryn Mawr was begun in 1880. Yet together with Barnard in 1900 they had 3,387 students and the students of all women's colleges in that year numbered 15,000 just under one-third of the 50,000 students in the nation's men's colleges, some of which boast foundations more than two centuries old.

Recently completed statistics show the attendance at the large institutions to be as follows: Harvard, 6,740; Columbia, 5,352; University of Chicago, 4,296; University of Michigan, 3,813; University of California, 3,696; University of Minnesota, 3,505; University of Illinois, 3,288; Cornell, 3,004; Yale, 2,584; University of Pennsylvania, 2,573.

## Grinnell asks Silver Bat on Grounds She Denied to Iowa Last Year

It is to laugh.

Grinnell is asking the state baseball league today to award her the silver bat for 1903 on the same ground on which Iowa claimed the bat last year and was refused it by the votes of Grinnell, Ames and Cornell.

Last year Iowa and Ames tied for the bat. A rule of the league reads that in case of a tie, the holder shall hold the bat. Iowa was the holder of the bat, having won it two times before.

About the end of the baseball season, Iowa and Grinnell tried to agree to play off the tie, but were unable to do so. After the Iowa team had gone to their homes, Grinnell offered to play. Iowa could not play, and for this, Grinnell, Ames and Cornell voted the bat to Grinnell.

The same thing happened this year. Grinnell, the holder of the bat, tied with Ames. After Grinnell's nine had gone home for the summer vacation, Ames wanted to play Grinnell.

Grinnell thinks now that she should be allowed to hold the bat. Grinnell regards the dissenting opinion filed last year by Iowa with great respect, notwithstanding the fact that Grinnell, Ames and Cornell voted it down.

UP TO IOWA

The decision of the matter is up to Iowa.

Iowa can either cast her vote in accordance with the precedent set last year, in which case Ames will receive the bat, or she can follow the views voted down last year by Grinnell, Ames and Cornell, in which case Grinnell will hold the bat another year.

These rules have been submitted to the various chapters for consideration and will probably be adopted at the next meeting of the chapter representatives.

A bowling tournament between teams representing the fraternities has also been suggested.

## OLYMPIAN GAMES

### IOWA TEAM MAY COMPETE AT ST. LOUIS

Team Will be Picked from Best Athletes Showing at the State Meet

Secretary Conaway of the Iowa commission of the Louisiana Purchase exposition at St. Louis next year will, within a few days, begin to agitate the question of sending an all Iowa team to represent the state at the Olympian games at the World's Fair next summer. Several months ago the plan was mentioned and received hearty advocacy from various prominent men in Iowa athletics. At the games next summer there will be a number of days for intercollegiate sports, and it is expected that a number of state colleges will be represented by teams.

The athletic games of the exposition will begin in May. On November 24, it is planned to hold contests for the college football championship of the country, the east against the west. The plan for an Iowa team will be to pick the best athletes of the state according to their performances at the state meet, and form them into one team and put them under a single trainer. The impracticable feature of the plan is the expense it will involve, but it is believed that this can be done away with.

The Olympian games proper will come August 29, 30 and 31 and September 1, 2 and 3. The rest of the summer will be filled with games of this country and other countries. Teams from all parts of the world will compete.

### SUMMER SESSION

Courses in Geology and Chemistry will be Added

Work has begun on the publication of the university's summer school announcement and it will be ready for distribution about Christmas time. No effort is being spared to make the coming session superior to anything previously given. There will perhaps be two or three outside instructors and it is probable that courses in geology and chemistry will be added to the courses given in former summer sessions. Inquiries are already coming in from every section of the state and great interest is being manifested all over the state in the courses which the university will have to offer during the next summer.

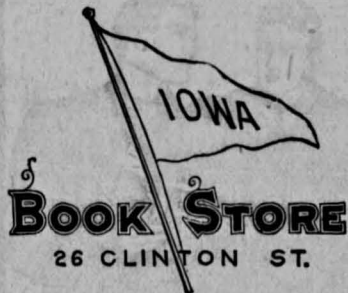

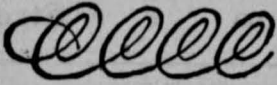
